## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

As Catholic Christians, we are so lucky to have a sacred treasure trove of wisdom and teaching that is ancient, eternal, consistent, and above all, it leads us to salvation. Among the many wonderful words and concepts that our faith gives us, I would like to highlight a word that is so important to us in this moment: **solidarity**. Some of you may remember this word from the Polish struggle for freedom from Communism in the 1980s, when the Catholic people gathered together to fight for the common good of their nation. Solidarity is the firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good. For us, solidarity takes the fullness of its meaning from the Eucharistic mystery.

The opposite of solidarity is selfish individualism. To be in solidarity means that you take as your own responsibility the good and flourishing of fellow human persons. Selfish individualism is that idea that comes from the evil spirit, tempting us to choose our own good exclusively without thought for our neighbor. It manifests itself with those actions which declare to the world: "I'm going to satisfy myself at all costs and sacrifice nothing for others."

Dear friends, we exist today because of the sacrifice of others. Every good we enjoy was given to us at the price of sacrifice for others. For this reason, in this moment in our faith journey, we must come to realize that, notwithstanding individual medical contraindications, receiving a vaccination for the COVID-19 virus is an act of solidarity in the protection of others.

In particular, it is of utmost importance that adults receive the vaccination as a measure to protect children who cannot at this time be vaccinated. It has been an eternal teaching of the Church that the protection of the most vulnerable is of the highest priority.

Thankfully, in Anniston, we enjoy a parish community that works beautifully to love one another and live this virtue of Christian Solidarity. I feel infinitely blessed that our faith community shines as an example to other communities in our area. May our faithfulness to the Eucharist be the source of our love for others. We eat the One Bread that is the Body of Christ, and as members of His body, living in solidarity, we can come to the Kingdom of Heaven together.

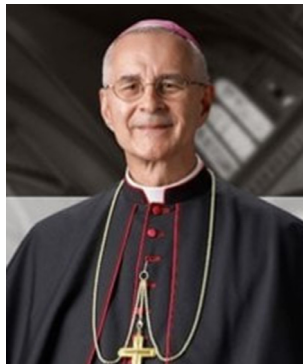
