

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Jesus teaches us many things. The best of teachers, exemplified by Jesus, teaches the lesson clearly and distinctly, and then gives good images to the students (disciples) as to what the concepts taught should look like in our lives and human experience. Jesus does all of this, but he also does something else that the best of teachers does: He gives his disciples freedom to let the lesson soak in and return to the teacher what they have truly learned and taken into their lives in an authentic way. Rather than "teaching to the test" or "cramming for the exam," we are called to be more concerned about authentic learning than simply obtaining a certain level of performance. The criteria of the final judgment will be authentic witness to Christ, not perfect performance that falls short of action for the kingdom.

Jesus is deeply moved because He sees how much his beloved children need to learn well from Him. He wants us to learn what it means to be members of His Mystical Body, how to live as the Church -One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic. To be one means to be in unity of faith, for us all to learn and know the doctrines and teachings of our faith and not to be indifferent to them. Holiness means to to live those teachings in our daily practice as Christians, and Catholic means dedication to belonging profoundly to a universal and all-encompassing Church, founded by Christ Himself. Living an apostolic life means working together and furthering the mission of the Kingdom of God in the World. This work requires learning how to work together in the Church, taking contemplation into action for the glory of God rather than for our own glory.

We see in our society that it becomes more and more undesirable to leave our homes and personal comforts to participate in sacred work with others for the common good. We see radical individualism characterizing whole generations of our fellow Christians, affecting vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life, as well as the vocation to sacred marriage and family. As the Mystical Body of Christ, we dedicate ourselves anew each Sunday to serve God in the Church with our whole lives, returning to Him the life and teachings He has with great love given us.


Our Second Collection Next Week is for Meals on Wheels


