A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Many people in this world suffer greatly, and their suffering becomes overwhelming to them. They find themselves in good company with Job, the "man of constant suffering." As a unique part of the Old Testament, the Book of Job deals with the problem of when a righteous, good, and faithful person encounters suffering in this life. Job calls out to God, expresses his suffering, and then in the reading we hear this Sunday, God begins a response to Job which will help him change the way he understands all the things of God and the universe. God reminds Job of His glory, wisdom, and power, and that He has created the universe and all it contains, along with poor, suffering Job… This response helps Job keep God at the center of the action of the Universe rather than himself.

Our Lord Jesus, the Son of the Living God, came into the world to teach us a way to transform our suffering through love. For us to be able to do this however, Jesus had to teach us to have faith in the truth of the heaven that God has prepared for us after this life ends. In chapter 14 of the Book of Job, Job cries out that he does not believe that man lives after death. Job cannot see beyond this life; his vision is impaired. At the end of the book, however, we see that Job has learned to look for more from God, to have faith and hope in God's promise of a new life. The Book of Job was preparing us to understand fully the teachings of Our Lord Jesus, so that we would have a way to understand our own suffering in the context of God's love and saving plan for all.

It happens fairly frequently that someone will call the parish and express their anguish and suffering, and they want the priest to come and "exorcize them" as they feel they are oppressed by demons and these demons are the source of their suffering. About 99% of all these calls come from people who are not Catholic or even baptized. It is rare that such a call comes even from a person who is a regular Sunday church-goer in any community. I always invite such callers to begin a regular practice of faith and prayer, and welcome them to come to join the Holy Church in a regular and orderly way.

These calls often come from those who are at the margins of society and who have been abandoned by different circumstances in this world. They are powerfully tossed about in the storms of life, but they have never been brought into the boat of the Holy Catholic Church. This is our work in this world, to bring the drowning out of the stormy seas into the boat of faith in God that we find in the Church. What is required for these cases, and indeed all cases of suffering is not the rare and extraordinary step of exorcism, but rather the Sacraments of the Church – Baptism, Eucharist, Reconciliation - that Jesus gave us, the ways He taught which bring us peace in stormy seas, the saving gift of faith that transforms the suffering person into a sign of hope in eternal life.




