A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

Lent is a sacred and special time of the year to renew oneself spiritually and draw closer to God. Simplicity of life is the central theme, shedding the many, many things which keep us distracted from God and His love, and specially those things in our lives which hinder His loving and purifying touch. Each one of us has unholy attachments to this world, things that we have convinced ourselves we cannot live without, but in truth, they are barriers in our relationship with God.

At the beginning of His earthly ministry, Jesus was called out into the desert by the Holy Spirit. In fact, the Scriptures tell us he was "driven by the Spirit." In that desert place, Our Lord was separated from every daily convenience of life . . . no shelter, no food, no chit-chat, no entertainments, nothing. It is in this place, however, that we hear that the angels, God's messengers, came to minister to Him. What we learn from this is that when we keep a good Lent, in some fashion stripping away all the unnecessary complications we cultivate in our lives, we can encounter God in a new way.

As we move into that "desert place" our attachments become clear and what we find might look different for each Christian. One person may find that he/she is called upon to put down the cell phone that they constantly check during the day. Another person might find that they are called to stop buying their special Starbucks coffee drink every day. Yet another person might find that they are called by the Spirit to spend the evenings playing a game with their children or their spouse rather than watching "The Crown" or something else on Netflix.

Freeing ourselves from these small attachments help us to encounter in a certain way the desert that Our Lord embraced in preparation to teach and save us from the Evil One. We know that He was tempted by Satan in the desert, and we will be tempted too. The grace of our Baptism and the company of Our Good Lord will strengthen us as we resist those temptations and choose the good.

Let us each pray for one another with great intensity this Lent. In our parish, there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross at 5:30 and Benediction at 6 pm each Friday, and there will be extra confessions on Tuesday evenings beginning at 5:30pm. Those simple things, above all the prayer and adoration of the Lord, will help us realize more deeply the gift of His Love. Invite a friend, and pray in unity and solidarity for our whole people!

There will also be a designated collection bowl on the narthex table for parishioners to write (anonymously, if you choose) and ask Father John questions about Confession. He will address these questions in his reflections throughout Lent.

So, let's get started this week with Video Session One: Where Are You? as we examine our experience of guilt and how God seeks us out and calls us back to Himself after we have sinned.

How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.
