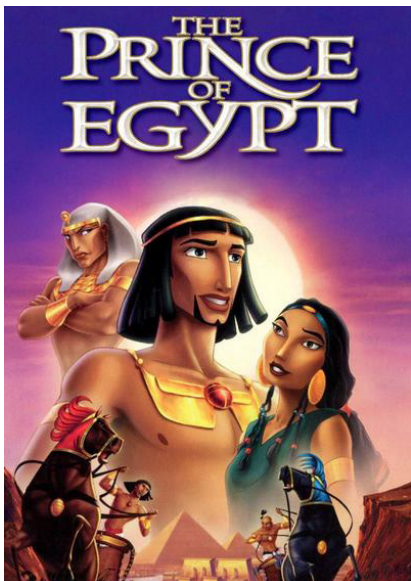

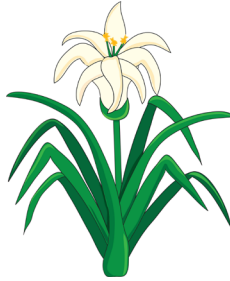

GRASS CUTTING MINISTRY

Mowing is usually done between Wednesday and Saturday to ensure good looking grounds for the weekend. Volunteers can bring their own equipment or use equipment provided by the church. We have two modern easy-to-operate riding mowers, a small tractor with finishing mower, two weed whackers and a leaf blower on hand. We supply the fuel.

Without our volunteers, this service would have to be contracted out; costing the parish a huge amount of funds needed for other operating expenses.

A meatless Lenten recipe from Chef Father John . . .

SPICY GARLIC CABBAGE (serves 6)

1 large cabbage	1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 large onion	1 TB your favorite hot sauce
2 cloves garlic	1/2 tsp. white pepper
2 TB cooking oil	1/2 - 3/4 cups of water
1 chicken bouillon cube	

Cut the cabbage in half lengthwise, then into quarters. Cut out the core and set aside. Slice the cabbage in 1/2 inch strips and place in a colander. Slice the core into fairly thin, bite-sized pieces. Wash the cabbage strips and the core in cool running water until it is all clean.

Heat up a large, covered pot over high heat, and once hot, add the oil, then the onion and garlic, and fry for a few minutes till the onion is starting to go translucent. Then, add the cabbage by handfuls and stir to mix. Add the salt, then the water, bouillon cube (broken into pieces), and the hot sauce. Stir, and cover tightly. Reduce the heat to medium and steam the cabbage for about 20-25 minutes. Uncover and add the white pepper and stir.

This dish is ever so yummy, but it does leave a strong odor in the house. I rather think it is worth it. This is good alongside a dish of beans and rice.
