A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

The human person has a tendency to interpret all things in the light of our own experience. Of course, experience can bring wisdom to a person, but for many people, even a long chain of experiences, positive and negative, sometimes don't bring any new insights to the person. The reason that wisdom doesn't come to some people is because they stubbornly refuse recognize that God is at the center of all things, not us, and they continue to try to understand everything in terms of themselves rather than in terms of the Almighty. This is where we

Job is suffering terribly, and his friends are trying to make him believe that he suffers because of something he did that offended God. His so-called friends are trying to convince him of his guilt, but despite all of his sufferings, Job NEVER blasphemes or rejects God. Job knows that God is at the center of the universe, and that God's ways are always right and true, even when our human reason cannot understand

or see the full picture.

For many people, this is a hard teaching, and I admit, it is a hard teaching for me to bring into my heart and mind. What helps me, and I hope helps all of us, is the truth that the same God that rules the universe and knows all things, also knows that we struggle, and for that very reason He sent His only Son into this world to suffer with us and to redeem our suffering in Himself.

It is so important for the Christian to meditate on the fact that Jesus walks with us in this world, not above us. Jesus walks the same path that we walk, and He suffers when we suffer. When we feel pain in our bodies and sorrow in our soul, He feels it with us. Jesus felt all the things we feel, and so we can pray along with him when we suffer. "Jesus, let me feel YOUR pain." This is an ancient prayer that helps us reach out in our own suffering to join ourselves to Christ, just as He reaches out to us with His loving touch.

The famous bumper sticker says: Jesus Saves! Truly He does, but how He does it is the beauty of the mystery: by putting Himself in the center of His people, Divine Wisdom, in love with us, and with the desire to heal us in all things.

weekend of Feb. 13/14 and sell their olive wood gifts.

They will speak to us about the dire Christian situation in the Holy Land. Their religious crafts are made in home workshops by Catholic families who make their day to day living by selling them to pilgrims and tourists that visit the holy sites and shrines.

With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and a lack of Christian pilgrims, the traditional workshops of Olivewood have sustained severe damage. Therefore, unemployment there is at an alltime high, around 90%. The Christian community relies on services offered to pilgrims as a main source of income for the community. Olive wood items and carvings are the only tangible products they can produce and export.

The Catholics of the Holy Land graciously ask your support through prayers and the purchase of these special religious art pieces. Proceeds of the sales generate much needed employment opportunities and monetary funds for 600 Catholic Families in Bethlehem.
