
A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

The Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ are truly present in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and His Presence remains with us both through our faithful communion with Him as well as sacramentally in

the Eucharist which is reserved in the tabernacle of the parish for veneration and for communion to the sick. Many studies today tell us that the majority of Catholic people are not able to speak clearly about this mystery of our faith, and many Catholics remain poorly catechized about the gift of the Eucharist.

Above all things, the gift of the Body and Blood of the Lord was given to us to establish a relationship between our loving God and us. In the Greek of the New Testament, the word used to speak about this relationship is "koinonia." We hear this word translated in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians as a "participa-



tion." The most common translation of the word "koinonia" is as "communion." Jesus gave us the Sacrament of His Body and Blood to keep us in relationship with Him and so that we can participate in every blessing that being a member of His Body brings.

By receiving His Body and Blood, the "AMEN" we say at communion time is a big "YES" to the covenant He has made with us, and being fed at His Table by His Body, we are committing ourselves to living in such a way that reinforces and reinvigorates the bond HE has established with us. Our lives are imperfect, and our world is damaged. Often we find ourselves angry and alone, finding fault from the sidelines and heckling as if we have all of the answers. Jesus says to us from the altar: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (John 6:56) It is when we strive to understand this that the answers to our questions become clearer.

Our Holy Communion not only brings us into relationship with God, but also with one another. To receive the Sacred Host is to desire to live more beautifully the mystery we receive. We know that the world is broken like the Body of the Lord was broken, but our desire to live this mystery in the midst of this world, no matter how imperfectly we begin, will be brought to completion by the grace of Our Savior.

The Eucharist we celebrate is not a sign or a symbol of Christ's love, it is His burning love front and center, present in this very moment. Proclaim the presence of the Lord and claim it as the fundamental orientation of life – to live at all costs in Holy Communion with the Lord and with our neighbor.

Gospel Reading

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."
