

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Here in our parish church we have one of the most lovely baptismal fonts in the diocese. It is designed to look like the baptismal pools of the early Catholic Christians which archaeologists have discovered in places such as Syria and Jordan. Also in Rome, one can find pools like this in the early churches.

The reason it is so special is that it represents beautifully the truths of what happens to us in the Sacrament of Baptism, and why it is essential that every person who seeks God be baptized. Today we hear in the Scriptures that Jesus went down into the Jordan River to be baptized. When He did, God the Father sent the Holy Spirit down on Him in the form of a Dove, and spoke the Words: "This is my beloved Son with whom I an well pleased." We learn a great deal from this moment.

When he went down into the Jordan, Jesus turned his back on the world in order to do the will of the Heavenly Father. When we are baptized, we turn our backs to the world and to the past, filled with sin, and make a new life of grace in Baptism. That is why we touch the Holy Water each time we come into the Church and when we leave...to remember the commitment we have made to do the Father's will in all things.

God's voice from Heaven identifies Jesus as His Son. In our Old Testament reading today, we hear that God calls his servant to suffer for the salvation of all, but here the servant becomes a son, and that is what happens to us in baptism as well. We are servants of God who have been made beloved sons and daughters of the Most High God, and our relationship to Him has that closeness and intimacy.

Finally, the Spirit comes down in the form of a dove upon Jesus. Here we have a manifestation of the Holy Trinity, Father Son, and Holy Spirit all together in One God. At that moment, the power and presence of God was given to the waters of Baptism in all times and in all places. Through Baptism, we all have the Holy Trinity dwelling in our hearts. Sometimes we hide the Trinity from others with our ugly actions, but we can always make the light of the Blessed Trinity shine each time we say no to the sins of Adam and Eve and YES to the love of God in our lives! Let's live our Baptism to its fullest!
