A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday we celebrate Ascension Day. Traditionally, Ascension Day is celebrated on the Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter because that day marks forty days since the Resurrection of Our Lord.

In our diocese, we celebrate Ascension Day on Sunday to help people not miss the Mass that celebrates this mystery.

The Forty Days between Easter and Ascension are deeply significant for our spiritual lives in Christ. (Acts 1:3) It is during these forty days that Jesus appears to His disciples and continues to lead and guide them in the formation of the Holy Church. In the Bible, the number forty is often used to indicate the time period required for a big project to come to completion. We know that forty days of rain began the great flood which erased sin and



made a new way for goodness, and forty years were required of the Israelites as they wandered in the desert before they were prepared to enter the promised land. We also know that Our Lord began his ministry on earth by fasting for forty days in the wilderness, and so the number forty is a signal that an important project has been initiated. What is our project?

In our case, the project is the most wonderful project ever - to proclaim the Truth of the Kingdom that we find in the person of Jesus Christ, and to build up His Holy Church which will lead us to heaven. Jesus ascended to the Father and is seated at His right hand. He will come in glory to judge the living and the dead. He will judge us based on how we have responded to the project he has begun. These forty days of Easter have given us a time to reflect on how we are going to respond to His call, how we are going to respond to His presence in our midst.

Each one of us has to decide what we are going to do in response to the graces and blessings we receive from the Lord Jesus. In Acts 1:11, the followers of Jesus are looking up into the sky at His Ascension, but the angel of God asks them: "Why are you gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus who has been taken up into heaven will come back in the same way that you have seen him go into heaven." And indeed He does this in every Eucharist we celebrate, the Lord Jesus comes down from heaven to be with us to strengthen us for our mission. Our Church doesn't have a mission, the MISSION has a Church, and we are it...ready to serve in his great project of salvation.

First Reading ACTS 8:5-8, 14-17

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy

Spirit." When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."
