

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Peace through scars. This is the message of the Sacred Scriptures on this Holy Pentecost Feast. Jesus presents Himself to his beloved ones in a profound way that they can feel deeply in their souls, but they do not understand what is happening until they see the scars in His hands and His side.

We often forget that in the fifty days after the Resurrection, the little flock of the Lord Jesus was in great confusion. They had lost their beloved Teacher and Shepherd, and it seemed that the whole might of the Roman Empire and the Jewish nation was bearing down upon them to destroy them. That is why they are locked away in the Upper Room for fear...they have no idea what is about to happen, they were scarred by their experience of the passion of the Lord.



But then, the Lord, faithful to His promise, comes to them in a profound way to give them peace and gather them together into a new reality that will be the strongest agent against evil and degradation that the world has ever seen – the Holy Church. Of course, the members of the Church have sinned and betrayed Jesus, scarring His Body again and again through these last two thousand years, but the Church, the Ecclesia, the Assembly of those called by the Lord to worship Him in Spirit in truth remains one, holy, catholic and apostolic – a gift of peace.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church, the day on which the followers of Jesus realized that they were something different than any other little faction of followers in the world. To this day, the world is full of little factions of followers of this upstart leader or that, but the followers of Jesus realize that they have been gathered together as something altogether different. St. Paul tells us that as members of the Church we are each a member of the Body of Christ Himself, and this is a precious identity. Paul reminds us that the Holy Spirit is the principle of unity for all who believe in Jesus, the Son of the Eternal Father, and he is very clear in telling us that EACH INDIVIDUAL receives some manifestation of the Holy Spirit in his or her life, and this gift is to be placed at the service of the Church.

What is my gift? This is a question many people ask, and many people have a hard time seeing or believing the gift they have been given. As a community of faithful Christians, we must help one another see, develop, and understand these gifts, so that all of us can grow in holiness and love together. Just as no one leaves the house without looking at least once in the mirror to see if everything is in place, so we as Christians need mirrors in one another, to help us see the beauty of the crowning gift which has placed on our heads by our wonderful God! Happy Pentecost!
