

FROM TODAY'S GOSPEL READING THE TRANSFIGURATION

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

On elementary school report cards from my generation, one of the things we were graded on were "listening skills." Our good teachers went about helping us to be good listeners, so that we didn't miss anything of the lesson being given to us. In our society as we experience it, one of the

things I find most striking is how few people there are in the society who are dedicated to listening rather than talking. The proliferation of messages and platforms given through YouTube, Facebook, and so many other social media outlets give a platform for so many to speak out, but how are we listening?

I even remember watching the change of format for talk shows in the late 80's, as they moved from a format like "Donahue" where individuals spoke, and others listened, to formats like "Jerry Springer" and "Geraldo" in which every show seemed to end with every-one speaking and shouting at once.

This Sunday, Our Blessed Lord gives us a model for listening to the most important things as we consider the life of Abraham, our father in faith. Abraham listened to the marvelous promises made to him by God, and though he perhaps did not understand them fully in his lifetime, he received God's Word into his heart, and it became an essential part of his being. This is listening. To take in what we are being told, making a judgment regarding the nature of what we are hearing, and if it is of God, to incorporate it at every level of our being – body, mind, and soul.

Abraham listened to God, and his mind and soul moved his body to go out to a new land to receive new promises, and we owe Holy Abraham a debt of gratitude that he listened so well to the Heavenly Father. With so many competing voices in our world, we must listen more intently to the voice of the Father, especially thorough moments of silent prayer and sacred reading. We must open the Scriptures to encounter the promises of God, making them a part of our being. The Friday Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament that we offer in Lent is an important time to pick up your Bible, come to the Church, and listen to what God is telling you. Without these dedicated moments of prayer, we cannot claim to be the best of listeners. God doesn't issue report cards with a grade for "listening skills," but we do open ourselves to His Divine Grace when we put on our sacred "listening caps" and come before him humbly, in Spirit and in truth

Come spend time with Jesus, who is truly present, body, blood, soul and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament.



From years past, what foods do you remember having with your family on Fridays during Lent?

Kitty Moore — My husband is from New Hampshire and every Friday his mother would make something called "Salmon Peawiggle." It was salmon with a white sauce and English peas.

Michele Lindsey — My mom would do spinach and egg or asparagus and egg sandwiches on fresh Italian bread.

Gail Tatton — We had tuna casserole every Friday during Lent.

Nancy Cassidy — We had salmon croquettes from canned salmon (I can still smell it!) or tuna noodle casserole with crushed potato chips on top. Our kitchen smelled of fish until Sunday.

Terri Pauluzzi — We had grilled cheese and PB&Js. We don't like fish.

Laura Forbus — It was cheese pizza. We kids loved that during Lent because we rarely bought pizza the rest of the year.

Pat Yates — We ate creamed peas (white mild gravy) and tuna on toast. We also had tomato soup with milk and grilled cheese sandwiches. Sometimes after a high school football game, we would go to a pizza place and order our pizzas to come out a minute after midnight!

Nanette Estes — We had what we called "Lenten Delight." Macaroni and onions fried in butter, vegetarian baked beans, deviled eggs and tuna salad. Sounds wacky and it needs to have all the different foods to taste right. But we always looked forward to having it.

Teresa Craig-Scheuring — We ate spinach and potatoes. My gram was Italian and a practicing Catholic. We never ate meat on Fridays all year.
