## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

The sacred year is drawing to a close. There are only two more Sundays left before the Church begins a new year of grace with the first Sunday of Advent on November 29th. We have come through a rough year, and we have experienced many things in our lives. Have our experiences this year helped to make us wiser? Now is the time for honest reflection and prayer to look back and see how our relationship with God has brought us holy wisdom.

The Gospel for this Sunday speaks to us about wise and foolish virgins. Jesus gives us an example of persons who in their own time might not have been considered among the "wise

ones" of the society because of their youth. But clearly, five of them are truly wise because they take into account all the details needed to celebrate fully with the Bridegroom when he comes. Here are some of the things the wise virgins offered to the Lord.

- 1. They were prudent. Prudence is to use one's reason correctly to bring about action for the good. They were thoughtful with the right purpose.
- 2. They were filled with respect for the one they loved. They anticipated the coming of the bridegroom by being prepared to bring the light that was necessary for the celebration.
- 3. They understood the importance of readiness. Though they fell asleep just like the foolish ones, the wise virgins were able to wake up and be ready at the moment the bridegroom came.
- 4. Being included in the feast was their greatest concern. All of their wisdom was geared towards being included in the wedding feast.

Our Eucharist is a wedding feast, and in fact, it is the feast at which the Bridegroom (Jesus) celebrates His being joined together with His Bride (the Church). We are wise when we spend the week preparing ourselves spiritually for what will happen on Sunday. The oil in our lamps is the energy we have reserved to celebrate beautifully when we are at Mass. By coming to church early, praying and meditating in our place, preparing the readings, knowing what liturgical season we are in, and by taking initiative to study on our own the prayers of the Mass, we do all four things the wise virgins did to welcome the Bridegroom. That way, Holy Wisdom leads us to recognize the presence of God in our midst, and if we have drawn closer to Him through our experiences, then we can say this year of grace has made us wiser disciples of Christ.

### African-American Saints-To-Be

THEA BOWMAN, a nun from the Deep South, is one of six people of color from the United States under consideration for sainthood.



Sister Thea was born in 1937, in Yazoo City, Mississippi, Raised as a Protestant, she became Catholic, with her parents' permission, at age 9.

Following a 16-year teaching career, Sister Thea became a consultant for intercultural awareness. She traveled the country giving presentations that encouraged communication between people of different cultures and races. She dedicated her life to fighting the evils of prejudice that drive people apart.

In 1984, Sister Thea was diagnosed with breast cancer. She prayed "to live until I die." Her prayer was answered, and she continued her work addressing groups from a wheelchair, until her death in 1990.
