


The flowers at the Pieta are given in memory of Larry Oblena by his family.

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



#### Dear Parish Family,

As the month of October comes to a close, our sacred calendar turns our minds to the great feast of the Church in November. The Feast of All Saints that we celebrate on November 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation, and all Catholics are required to attend Mass that day in order to hear the Scriptures proclaimed and witness the mystery of the Eucharist celebrated. It is such an important day for us because it commemorates all those people who are just like you and me who have come to the fullness of glory in the kingdom of heaven, and are saints. Sanctity is often viewed as something unobtainable,

and in fact, the prevailing society teaches strongly that the human person is incapable physically, emotionally, and psychologically of what we refer to as "holiness."

Holiness is the burning desire to know, love, and serve God, and it is something each one of us has been given in great measure through our baptism. All that is really required on our part is cooperation with God's will for us, as he leads and guides us to Him. The words of Our Lord from the Cross: "Into your hands I commit my spirit" are also the same words from Psalm 31, which is a psalm asking God to keep us from shame and snares and degradation.

Recently, another member of the clergy suggested to me that speaking about such ideas is nothing more than "theological muzak" - just murmurings that pious people make in the background of their lives. But rather, I think the work of the Christian is more in the line of not ignoring and dismissing the "background music" of our existence, but rather considering it more carefully and lovingly, asking where that sacred sound comes from, who plays it, and moreover, how often it is dismissed by our internal pride and petty, disordered desires.

God has provided absolutely everything for us to live holy, right lives. There is nothing keeping us from loving him with all our heart, mind, and soul. We can each choose to love our neighbor as our self. In his foundational philosophical work, Love and Responsibility, Pope John Paul II tells us clearly "the person is an entity that exists and the only proper and adequate way to relate to that person is love." This is what every saint in heaven discovered when they were still on earth. Let's celebrate these holy days thinking about how we can love more, lighting up this dark world with the lights of holiness, purity, and love.


