Dear Parish Family,

There is a phrase which for many years was an integral part of the formation of young people as they grew up and matured into adulthood. That phrase is: "the common good." In many ways, it seems that in our society and community, the idea of the "common good" has faded significantly from our minds and our speech, and has in many ways been replaced with a stronger focus on the individual good, or "what is best for ME."

Our Church teaches us that the individual good and the common good are linked together inextricably, and more importantly, it teaches that: "the common good that people seek and attain in the formation of social communities is the guarantee of their personal, familial and associative good." What this means is that our own good is guaranteed by seeking the common good. The Church is that holy body that stands with every man and woman of every place and time, and each of us is a member of that Body by virtue of our baptism.

This Sunday is our Catholic Charities Appeal Sunday, and this call for help is not simply a call to give alms, but is also a call to be active and involved as a member of the Body of Christ, reaching out in whatever way we can to promote the common good in our society, looking out for those who are cast aside, left behind, and excluded from the goods so many of us freely enjoy.

Our Lord asks us in the Gospel this Sunday to consider how we respond when the Lord asks us to sacrifice what we want to do in order to go out and work in His vineyard. When the Father asks us to go out to do His work, in each of us there might be some resistance that wells up initially when we are asked to make this sacrifice of will. After a while, however, if we allow virtue and goodness to act in us, we can, like the son in the Gospel, turn to go and do our Father's will in the vineyard.

It would appear from all that we see in the news and in popular culture, that what is often farthest from the minds of many is how each one of us can sacrifice in order to aid the common good. We can, however, make a huge difference for the common good, each one of us in his/her own way, as we consider how we can help our Church reach out to those most in need. Bishop Raica has told us that he wants to know our needs and concerns, and in that way, he will lead us in prayer and action for the good of all


