# MASS



Jesus gave the Apostles, who were the first priests, the power to change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus.



When the priest is at the altar, he uses certain items for the Sacrifice of the Mass.

Next time you attend Mass, look closely for these items and how they are used.



## Match Definition with the pictures.

1. The table or structure on which the church's sacred meal is celebrated.
2. The celebrant often holds up a larger one during Mass and breaks it into pieces just as Jesus broke bread at the Last Supper.
3. A special plate that holds the Celebrant's Host.
4. At least two of these must be lit during Mass
5. A cup usually made from precious metal like gold or silver that the priest pours the wine and a little water into before it becomes the Blood of Jesus.
6. A book with all the prayers used by the priest at Mass.
7. Bottles that hold the water or wine that are carried to the altar at the Preparation of the Gifts.
8. A cross with the body of Jesus hanging on it.
9. A small piece of white linen, marked with a cross in the center, used to cleanse the chalice during the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
10. A priest is a baptized man who has received the Sacrament of Holy Orders.
