# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

No virtuous act is ever wasted. But it can seem that, from time to time, our good deeds don't seem to be making the difference we wish to see in the world, and as a result, we become frustrated and doubtful about many things, even to the point of doubting the power of God. We are frustrated in this way because we fail to see our connectedness to one another and to God, and a sense of isolation creeps in to discourage us.

But Jesus teaches us in the Gospel that even the simplest act of kindness that is

done in unity with Him is tremendously powerful. Jesus shows us the way of power in connection with goodness and virtue, and He also gives us a glimpse of the insanity and chaos that can come from our sinfulness and self-gratifying desires.

We see Jesus, in Mark's Gospel, use what is called a "Hebraism." It is a pattern of speech used in the time of Jesus in order to make a clear point by saying exaggerated things. It is a lot like saying: "The line was a MILLION miles long!" It isn't really a million miles, but you get the point that it was really long! Jesus suggests that we cut of the members of our body that are causing us to sin, not because He is focused like a pharisaical puritan on getting rid of offending members, but rather to make us aware of the utter ridiculousness of our selfishness and sinfulness. No one in their right mind cuts off their hands and feet, it is certainly better to do good deeds in the name of Jesus. That is the context of the whole teaching, as we see someone performing good deeds in the name of Jesus who is not yet one of the disciples.

Jesus shows us that it isn't ridiculous, however, to believe and act on the tremendous power of goodness, kindness, and virtue. These things find their best expression in the community of believers and in the greater community of all men and women of good will. We need this awareness desperately in our days, when so many put their individual, personal good/pleasure above the common good, without any thought for the consequences of their sinfulness that are felt in the larger community. Each one of us can dedicate ourselves newly to work for the good of all by joining our sacrifices and actions to the Sacrifice of Christ, and by doing so we will "surely not lose our reward."


