A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

The Lord Jesus gives to us the clear example of a child as the one who is to be received and served by those who follow Him. As with all of the things that Jesus teaches his followers, there is a clear and practical side to this teaching, and there is also a deeper meaning for each disciple to discover.

We see that in our world today, children are vulnerable to increasing violence, exploitation, and neglect. After all the years I have worked in Catholic schools and with families in parishes, I remain scarred and

deeply saddened by what I have witnessed first hand regarding the suffering endured by children at the hands of their parents and others who were supposed to care for them. Adultery, selfishness, egoism, and hedonism on the part of so-called adults cause a truly devilish and destructive storm that leaves many damaged bodies, minds, and souls in its wake.

The Gospel we hear this Sunday has three distinct moments: 1.) Jesus teaches clearly about the sacrifice that will be necessary for the redemption of the world, 2.) the Apostles, hearing this teaching, do not allow it at first to change them, and turn to self-centered arguments over personal importance, and then 3.) Jesus corrects their selfishness by teaching them to serve the child in their midst in the same way they would serve Him. These followers of Christ had a hard time putting together the idea that true sacrifice for another person is the ultimate act of humility and love. Jesus was patient, however, and taught them that lesson at every turn. We need to learn that lesson better as well.

The mystery of the Nativity brings us clear vision of the Father's love and the act of humility in sending His Son to be born as a tender child in a stable in Bethlehem. The tenderness of the Christmas mystery is not bound by the calendar, but is a mystery to be lived at every moment of the year. This mystery is also present in the Eucharist, when the Son of God comes humbly and lovingly to us in the Host, loving and healing us through His Sacrifice.

Thus, it's no surprise that by attacking children the evil spirit tries to destroy the community of believers. The child has an immense potential for understanding God and the ways of the Spirit. This insight was captured beautifully by the first book of the famous Maria Montessori, which was entitled: "The Child in the Church." She says: "A person's respect for another shows itself best when, not regarding himself as superior to the other, he makes himself an equal." Interestingly, the child actually never leaves the human person, it simply gets forgotten and neglected as one ages and experiences this fallen world. That inner child can be easily remembered, however, and can turn to God with ease and confidence, open to receive the grace and protecting care of the Loving Savior.
