

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

It can happen that when things do not seem to be going our way, when we encounter suffering and resistance in our Christian journey, that the spirit of evil will lie to us and tell us that we have chosen wrongly when we choose Christ. Advertising and social media thrive on showing us how perfect and joy-filled our lives can be if we only purchase what they are selling, or if we change our lives to be like theirs. This is never true. The happiness that Jesus promises us comes from being one of his flock, one of the beloved lambs of the Good Shepherd – foundational happiness comes from belonging.

Christianity is unique among the religions of the world because Our Savior does not ever propose an escape from suffering. Other religions teach that certain actions and prayers can free the follower from suffering in this life, but Jesus never promises that. What Jesus promises is that He will remain with us and that He will give us eternal life with Him in heaven. Jesus promises that He will transform our suffering into love if we permit Him to do so. This is one meaning of the "robes made white in the blood of the Lamb." John has a vision of those who have "survived the time of great distress." It is a vision of those followers of Jesus who have persevered in their love of Him even in the face of suffering and pain.

It is a hard sell. No one wants to suffer or experience pain. Some of the largest industries/activities on earth exist to either to numb pain and suffering or distract us from it. Somehow, though, in the end, we don't find the total relief we are looking for. Jesus, however, through His teachings, His Sacraments, His Church, and His grace, does give us a way out of our sufferings. St. John gives us a powerful promise: "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes..." Our pain might produce tears, but Our God wipes them away with great tenderness when we turn our faces to Him. The transformative love of Christ led the Apostles out in mission, and they encountered suffering, but in the end, they were given eternal life with God in heaven, led by a Good Shepherd who walked with them the whole way to heaven.




