A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

The Prophet Amos speaks powerful words to the People of God. What is characteristic of Amos, however, is the clear household imagery he uses to paint a picture of the laziness and impiety of the people, a people drunk on their own comfort and ease of life. What we know about the Prophet Amos is that he was a rural person, a type of gardener, whose lifelong job was to trim trees so that they would bear more fruit. He was likely a person who would have worked outside most of the time, and who would not have had a lot of formal education. This does not mean, however, that the Prophet Amos was not intelligent, however. In fact, the simplicity of his life is what allows him to see so clearly the sinfulness of the People of God, who have grown accustomed to their rich way of life.

Wealthy people first seek to use their money to separate themselves from those poorer than they are. We see this throughout human history and in our own day. First-class plane tickets, five-star hotels, etc., all show us that money is used to separate people and to provide a protected and special experience for those who have wealth. The danger of that wealth is that through separation from the harsher realities of this life, a person is fooled into thinking that they are "doing just fine" and that "everything is O.K.," especially in regard to the things of God.

That type of isolation is what Our Lord speaks of in the story of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man, who tradition tells us was called "Dives," is blissfully unaware of the suffering and poverty right on his doorstep, because he lives serenely in his palace, separated not only by space, but also by attitude, from the dying man at his gate. God, however, is always aware of the suffering of His children, and the work of Christians, as we are told by St. Vincent DePaul, is to "See the face of Christ in the other and then be the face of Christ for the other." This means to look with compassion, desiring the salvation of the other person, and then sacrifice for that salvation with the Christ.

Considering oneself separate or in a different class from the less fortunate is not the Gospel message. There is no such thing as "the deserving poor" in the eyes of the Christ. We are called to be active in love and charity and to reach out in the ways we can to those who cry out for mercy and love.
