A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

The Trinity is the most foundational doctrine of Christianity. The understanding of one God in three divine persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is the cornerstone of all Christian teaching. We are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and it is perhaps the first thing our parents teach us – to make the Sign of the Cross, and finally, at the graveside, the last thing a priest does is to make the Sign of the Cross in blessing over the deceased's body and the mourners. Our Christian lives should be characterized by how we live that Trinitarian love. Though the word "Trinity" is not found in sacred scripture, it is still the foundational teaching about the nature of God and His relationship to us.

The sacred scriptures reveal to us that the Father is the creator of the Universe. God does not create alone, but is accompanied by the Son, who is revealed as Holy Wisdom. That wisdom of the Father is poured out on us in the love of the Holy Spirit, and this is the way God presents himself to us both as individuals and as members of His Church. Creation, wisdom, and love are what we are called to receive and live in as followers of Christ. Though we think of the creation of the world as a point far away in history, the truth is that Creation occurs even now, around us and in our hearts and minds. The divine creative impulse is very much at work, and it is beautiful to be caught up in it! Everything that lives, changes, and we are in that category, especially if we understand ourselves in relationship with God.

We read in the Book of Proverbs that it is Holy Wisdom that gives us delight. I often think how rarely people in our current day speak of wisdom as a virtue. To be wise is to seek to be like God, bringing our will into communion with His will. The opposite of wisdom is rebellion in the soul against God, and nothing but unhappiness and isolation are the result of that idiotic rebellion.

Being a vessel of His wisdom means letting the Holy Spirit pour out love into our hearts. I love that metaphor, because it describes such a perfect act – pouring out something precious from one vessel into another. It is very much the way that Jesus poured out His Body and Blood that are now received by the chalice and the paten at Mass. Then, in a wonderful way, those who receive Holy Communion become the vessels of His Love, so we can, in turn, pour out God's Triune love for others!

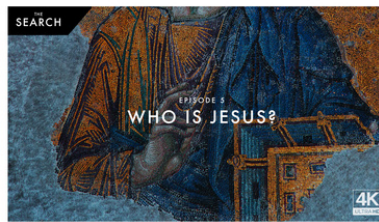

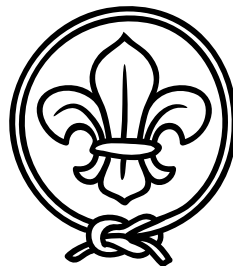
