One in Eight

I am "1 in 8". Do you know what "1 in 8" represents? One in eight couples have an infertility problem. I am one in eight. Do you know someone who has problems conceiving? I didn't know as a little girl that having a family would be difficult. I didn't know it would take a path less traveled. God knew. He knew that I would need Him, and a strong faith in Him. He knew

Jeff and I have always wanted a large family. We had no idea we would walk a journey that wouldn't be traditional, in the world's view. We were married in 1993. We found out not long after we were married that we had an infertility problem. We prayed and began to seek what options we had. However, doctors were not as aggressive towards treatment as they are

today. Timelines. This would be a word that would stay with us for a long time. It's a faith and trust lesson that we have learned through many experiences.

At the beginning of our infertility path, we didn't have anyone to talk to because everyone around us was having their first, second, and

even third babies. No one could relate to what we were going through.

I won't say it didn't bother us. I won't say it wasn't difficult – it was a hard time in our lives. I knew God had a plan for us to have a family, but I was beginning to wonder when that would happen. When would He show us this family? How was that plan going to happen?

We always have ideas of how things should happen. But God always has the PERFECT plan. We had to wait and fully depend on His plan for our family. We became foster parents as we waited. We had many children go through our home, but none stayed long-term.

I searched Bible verses to help me through this. One verse that I found and clung to was Psalm 37:7a "Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him that prospereth in his way..."

This seemed easy at first. As time kept going, and we weren't having the family I thought God had for us, it became difficult. What I didn't know was the children He was placing in our homes was the family He wanted us to have AT THAT TIME.

I didn't know it wouldn't be a permanent family. I didn't know that ministering to small babies, toddlers, and children would help them and us.

We began seeing more and more specialists to get help. We had so many doctor visits, procedures, and treatments, until finally our doctor told us our hope to have biological children would be through IVF (in-vitro fertilization). This still made us wait longer than we wanted.

We had so many people praying for us. Another verse that helped was Psalm 33:20, "Our soul waiteth for the LORD: he is our help and our shield." Again, I didn't know how this road was going to look, but I clung to His strength that He would give us biological children, somehow.

I mentioned timing - a timeline, before. There was one recurring lesson throughout our whole infertility issue. God has His timing, and it's not about our timing. We recognized that timing issue.

Jeff came back from the Iraq War (2003) and we were able to get into a military hospital treatment program in order to try for our last IVF. We had previously been told it had a long waiting list. Praise God for His timing! This treatment program was out of state and had so many hurdles and hoops that were no obstacle for God. This part of the story is a story within itself, for another time.

Fast forward - God is good! He blessed us with TWO biological babies, we started fostering again, and God allowed two to stay in our home and we adopted them. He gave us the number of children we had always wanted - FOUR!

This isn't a hard subject for me to talk about, especially now. However, putting the words together in written form, well, that's the hard part. I wanted to share about God's timing, faithfulness, and goodness.

There's more I could tell you about how good God is to me, but that's for another story. I also wanted to share because I feel that this isn't something that is talked about much. It is deeply personal and everyone is affected differently. But I pray that God uses this to reach someone that can be encouraged through His Word and His faithfulness.

CREAMY ITALIAN SAUSAGE + POTATO SOUP

Ingredients

- 1 pound mild Italian sausage
- 2 pounds Russet potatoes, diced
- 6 cups low-sodium chicken stock
- 3 cups chopped kale or spinach
- 1 cup heavy cream
- ½ cup parmesan cheese, shredded
- Kosher salt and black pepper to taste
- 1. Brown and crumble Italian sausage in a large stock pot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Remove sausage with a slotted spoon and drain excess drippings from pot.
- 2. Return sausage to pot and add potatoes, chicken stock, ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon black pepper. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to medium. Cook until potatoes are tender.

- 3. Use a slotted spoon to remove ½ of potatoes from pot. In a separate bowl, mash potatoes then return them to the pot. Stir in kale or spinach leaves, heavy cream, and more salt and pepper, to taste. Cook until kale is tender, about 2-3 minutes.
- 4. To serve, garnish with shredded parmesan cheese & freshly cracked black pepper.
