## "Miracle" Defined

"An extraordinary event manifesting divine intervention in human affairs"



"Miracles are events that supersede the laws of nature, performed by divine power and for a divine purpose." (LifeQuest Volume 1)

#### Matthew 4:23



- 3. Demonstration of Authority




#### Compassion

"And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with <u>compassion</u> toward them, and he healed their sick." - Matthew 14:14

"But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him:" - John 12:37




"And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book:" - John 20:30

Feeding multitudes with little food Mark 6:32-44; 8:1-9



Withering of the fig tree

Matthew 21:18-22



Resurrecting the dead Matthew 9:18-26 (Jairus' daughter)



Resurrecting the dead Luke 7:11-17 (widow's son)




Resurrecting the dead

John 11:1-44 (His friend Lazarus)



The gospels record approximately three dozen specific miracles!



The gospel of John contains the least amount of miracles but the most distinct of miracles.



"And there are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written. Amen."

The Wedding at Cana

Let's read John 2:1-12



## Jesus' First Miracle Emphasized the significance of marriage?



"Woman, what have I to do with thee? (v.4)"

Jesus emphasized that Mary should not longer think of Him as her son.



"Mine our is not yet come (v.4)"

Throughout the gospels, Jesus is conscious that He is doing the will of the Father.



"Six waterspouts of stone... containing two or three firkins apiece" (v.6)"

Each pot would contain from 17 to 25 gallons. Total volume changed to wine was about 100-150 gallons.



"thou has kept the good wine until now" (v.10)"

The symbolism is clear. The power of Christ filled the emptiness of the waterpots and the same power is able to fill the emptiness of Judaistic religion."



"and manifested forth his glory" (v.11)"

"Miracles" here is "sign". The sign drew attention to the power and the glory of the One who performed it!



The greatest miracle is salvation! The reality that a sinner, born separated from God, can have a personal relationship with God by trusting in His Son (Jesus Christ) for forgiveness of their sin.



"For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him."
