“...and set him on his own _____.” Luke 10:34 Here is another beautiful picture. The Samaritan came where the poor man was and then took the poor man back where the Samaritan had been.

“...and _____ him to an inn.” Luke 10:34 The inn is a picture of a church. When person is saved, he must be cared for; this is why we have a church. Notice, this happened immediately. The Christian should join the church as soon as he is saved.

“And on the morrow when he _____.” Luke 10:35 Here is a picture of Jesus going back to Heaven.
