The story is told of a group of ladies who met together every week to study the Bible. When they got to the book of Malachi in the Old Testament, they came upon the third verse of the third chapter, which says that the Lord, "He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver" (Malachi 3:3). Wondering what this statement meant about the character and nature of God, one of the women offered to find out the process of refining silver.

That week, she arranged to watch a silversmith at work. As she watched the silversmith working on a particular piece, he explained that the only way to purify and refine silver is to hold it in the middle of the fire where the flames were hottest so that all the impurities are burned away.

The woman thought back on how "He sits as a refiner and purifier of

silver" (Malachi 3:3), and about how God holds us in such a place.

She asked the silversmith if it was true that he had to sit there in front of the fire the whole time the silver was being refined.

The silversmith told her that he not only had to stay there holding the silver, but he had to keep his eyes on the silver every second, because if it was left in the flames even a moment too long, the silver would be destroyed.

The woman was silent for a moment. Then she asked the silversmith, "How do you know when the silver is fully refined?" He smiled knowingly and said, "Oh, that's easy...when I see my image reflected in it."

When we feel the heat of the Refiner's fire in our trials and

heartaches, what a precious comfort it is to know that our God is still fully in control, His eyes never leave us, and there is purpose in the struggle. And what strength and confidence we gain from the knowledge that we are "predestined to be conformed to the image of God's Son" (Romans 8:29). If today you are feeling the heat of the fire, remember that God has His eye on you and will keep watching you until He sees His image in you.

When I was 9 years old, my mother was killed in a car accident. I had to grow up fast and face many hardships as a child. I look at my now 9 year old and couldn't imagine her having to face what I did. Many people faced with hard times give up, turn to drugs, or just mentally shut down.

Thankfully my parents raised me to know the Lord and instilled in me God's promises to love me, take care of me, and never leave me. I always knew He was there. My family situation wasn't the best and when I turned 18 years old I moved out on my own and started working to put myself through nursing school. I think that was another testament of how God was with me because if you've ever been to nursing school you know you can't make it through without God's guidance. It was there I found my love to help others - the true calling of a nurse. I not only found joy in helping others, but I guess you could say I found myself. God has shown me what He wanted me to do with my life. Had I not been faced with my mother's death at such a young age, I wouldn't have valued life so preciously and viewed it from the other side - the side of loss and how it feels to lose someone close to you.

God gave me a passion to help - but He has also given me the desire to help the sickest patient in the hospital. Critical care is an area where you never know what to expect and things change minute to minute. You never forget the patients and families that you come to love. You never forget your first loss, or your first time having to tell a family member their loved one didn't make it.

It is in those moments that God helps you use those unique gifts to help comfort grieving families such as helping a husband tell his wife of 60 years, goodbye or parents of a young adult who lost his battle with cancer say their final goodbyes to their child.

I have had many families ask me how I can work in this kind of environment and my answer is always the same. God gave me a gift to use and the desire of my heart to help others. I know without a shadow of a doubt God has put me where He wants me to be.

Yes, some days I cry with my patients and their families, and yes there are shifts where I don't think I can handle it anymore. It is then I remember the patients that walked out of the hospital that the doctor said never would.

Prayer is the best medicine and God is the best doctor. Using those gifts God has equipped you with not only blesses others but blesses you in return. Use the gifts God has equipped you with and you may find that He opens your eyes to many things you never dreamed possible.



TORTELLINI WITH TOMATO SPINACH CREAM SAUCE

- 16 oz tortellini
- 1 (28 oz) can diced tomatoes with juices
- 1 cup fresh spinach chopped
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 2 teaspoon basil dried
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1-1/2 cups whole milk or a combination of heavy cream and milk
- 2 tablespoon butter*
- 2 tablespoon flour
- 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese

Directions:

- 1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil and add the tortellini until they rise (about 4 minutes). Drain. Hint: cover the water as it heats to bring it to a boiler quicker.
- 2. In a large pan or wok, saute the tomatoes, spinach, garlic, basil, salt, and pepper over medium heat until the water from the tomatoes bubbles, about 3 minutes.
- 3. Add the milk, butter, and flour. Stir to incorporate the flour into the butter. Add the Parmesan and stir well. Simmer for 3 minutes as the sauce thickens.
- 4. Remove from heat and toss with tortellini.

Note: *If using part milk and part heavy cream, do not use butter.

ONE BOWL CHOCOLATE CAKE

For the cake:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup buttermilk see note
- 1/2 cup hot water


For the frosting:


- 5 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1.25 cup powdered sugar
- 2 to 3 tablespoons milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together all the dry ingredients. Add egg, oil, and buttermilk and whisk well. Add hot water and whisk until the batter is smooth. Pour into prepared 8" pan.
- 3. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes OR until the toothpick inserted comes out clean.
- 4. Frosting: melt butter in a saucepan over medium-low heat. Add cocoa powder and whisk. Cook 2 min; do not boil. Remove saucepan from heat. Add sifted powdered sugar and whisk. Add vanilla and milk, one tablespoon at a time. Pour over warm cake and spread with a spatula. Let cool.
