The New Year's Lesson

Manufacturers and merchants periodically take inventory. They have inventory sheets upon which they write the stock number, the description of the item and the quantity of that item.

The inventory aids them in knowing what materials they need to order, what commodity in their line is in the most demand, what commodity they can discontinue.

Think back over the year that is past, and write down all the outstanding events in their lives that took place during the year.

Write down things that were started or continued in the last year that meant a closer fellowship with the Lord.

The Lord had commanded the Children of Israel that once a year there should be a Day of Atonement. (Leviticus 16:34, 23:23-32)

The people were to gather together at the tabernacle, bringing their sacrifices, remembering their sins and waiting upon the priests to offer the sacrifices and to ask God to forgive their sins.

As the people gathered each year, no doubt the year that just ended—with its joys and sorrows, its triumphs and defeats, its blessings and testings—flashed before their minds.

The Lord commanded the people that they must afflict their souls as they gathered on the Day of Atonement—they must bring themselves low before the Lord.

If any person did not humble himself before the Lord, repenting of his sins, he would be "cut off" from among his people.

There was to be, therefore, a set time once a year when each individual person stood soberly before God. An example of these times is given in I Samuel 1 and 2.
