P&C Objectives

BBQ – successful first election BBQ where all profits went to support the band Big Thank you for everyone who supported on the day but also baked many sweet goods After cost \sim \$4K

End of year Party – P&C paid for all 15 classes to have an onsite party in their classroom. Catered by Wills canteen. Well received event by parents, carers and most importantly students and teachers.

P&C also supported Teaching/staff holiday dinner

4) Principle's Update - Update School vision for 2022-24

School Plan should have started last year (but realistically started in 2022)
Self-assessment (validating in 14 key areas. Rated towards delivering, excelling.
Sustaining and growing)
Creating an environment of high expectations

3 key areas: **student growth & Attainment** (soft skills – collaboration, investigative learnings, strategic resourcing) Updating the interactive whiteboards.

Collaboration and collective efficacy – team teaching, assessing together. Collective responsibility. John Hatty – did a bit of research. Collective efficacy is the biggest.

3X a term to collaborate.

Focus groups with families (ie: Flodge flyers, forest lodge talks? Info session?)

Speech therapists

Environment – proper learning environment. To support Social, emotional, physical growth Playgrounds were upgraded in 2020

\$1M – NSW provided to improve teaching spaces Currently 15 classes (made decision to keep classes small)

5) Financial Report (Profit and Loss)

In a typical year the P&C makes a profit of \$35-\$40k which goes to the School to improve learning outcomes for the kids

This profit is the net of all fundraising activities less costs to host events less the general costs of running the P&C (insurance, IT costs, bank charges etc.)

For the past two years fundraising has been severely impacted due to COVID-19

In 2020 there were no fundraising activities

In 2021 we raised \$7k from on-line donations to support the students returning to school (funding air purifiers etc).

In 2022 year to date we raised net of just over \$4k from the local election BBQ, which we have provided to the band (also severely impacted by COVID-19)

P&C funds are pretty low currently. Need everyone's support for the rest of 2022 to get fundraising back to historical levels, now that we can host physical events again

JJ – P&C levy (in high school) maybe this is something we could think about doing? (Sydney Secondary College raised \$70K!)

GG- P&C exec raised that issue. Mindful that people are coming out of covi LO (Kindy) – Are the parents aware what or how much money is required? SR – Yes this where we need to share this

6) Learning & Support

L&S team:

Team – SLSO (student learning support officer)

Require additional support for learning and wellbeing Integration funding support – need to apply. Quite a big process. Child needs a diagnosis(autism and mental health)

ADHD and dyslexia isn't covered

No guarantees that you will get funding even if you apply.

NCCD - National collection X data

professional judgement from the teachers

Discuss children who needs additional support (any complexity of need) - 30% of children have been identified who fit into this category.

Personalized learning plans – 3 teachers sit together and sort out what is required for the new year. Strategies to make those goals. (Semester 1)

(SR) We try and provide adjustments. Which is why we are keeping classes to a smaller size. \$185K (school puts in \$60K)

NPLAN - only 2 - 3% in the lower bands.

We as a school, are very low for funding.

ZA- Main contribution – area. NPLAN are high performing.

60-70% above average.

Impose the levy because we don't much support.

Action: P&C to decide how much is a "levy" might be

ZA – maybe have a "sliding scale"

Ling – maybe show/communicate more value? School's "needs and why"

JJ – usually there is more comms around where the money go towards
