

What Happens in Music Lessons? Play, Sing, Create, Move, Listen and Express Yourself!









Instruments & Context

Students have been learning to sing and play a range of instruments, such as djembe and glockenspiel. This has provided a platform to develop a foundational understanding of musical concepts, such as rhythm and pitch.



Lessons take into account the wide variety of musical experiences and knowledge that different students come to school with. Differentiation ensures that all students are supported, engaged and extended - dependent on their individual interests and needs. For example, students who are learning other instruments are encouraged to bring their own instruments and various arrangements of songs are created for them.



Other comments and discussion:

- The classes follow the Australian syllabus for primary school music.
- Stage 3 electronic music students are learning using this online tool https://learningmusic.ableton.com/
- Question (Garth) how did you start the year for different stages, where older kids haven't been through the earlier curriculum? Started with assessment and learning where the kids are at, then building that fundamental knowledge. Also incorporated kids where they could bring their own instruments and existing knowledge. Drumming is a great way to get everyone started as well.





- Question (George) great to see this program active. How do you cater for kids who may have extra or different learning support needs? It's built in to how the class runs, a variety of options are available depending where and how a child is ready to engage, eg. some kids can be dancing while others are playing drums. If someone has a strong interest in one area that can be incorporated all along the way. Music can be a therapy! So it's about using the music to bring up energy or bring it down, reading the room. For sensory needs we have the option of headphones if kids find that helpful.
- Question (George) could there be an additional class or group that may be beneficial for some students, as a learning support for those kids? Kate is thinking of ways to offer different groups that allow focus on certain areas like melody or rhythm that suits those kids. e.g. a drumming circle at lunchtimes. Other games where kids can join in different ways.



6) Ben Southwell - Cobden Hayson

Garth introduced Ben, expressed appreciation for the partnership that has been in place for some years now.

Ben shared that he has appreciated the relationship and the partnership with Forest Lodge. It is exciting to see the achievements at Forest Lodge especially the music program success and this is something Ben is really passionate about - Ben's donation supported the music program this year.

The plan started with a commission-free sale, and has now evolved into also including the referral which is posted on the sign near the school. The commission free sale will also continue once a year which means the commission will be passed directly to the school as a donation from Cobden Hayson. Commission is 1.1% which is less than many other RE. It can be for someone associated or known/referred from the school. This will be on offer as a draw at the comedy night in Term 4!

Garth suggested the comedy night can be used to promote this opportunity to bring in interest for Ben's initiative. Garth and Ben will keep working on this.



There was an earlier blog post about this partnership here.

Some discussion on how to promote the commission-free sale with Ben. Last year it was also linked with the Halloween raffle, with a hand-out card advertising both Cobden Hayson offer and the Halloween raffle.

A letterbox drop suggested as an option to get the word out. Another suggestion is a facebook advertising campaign - you can pay for and add to the targeted people in the area.

- 40k of the 55k in the account is a grant that is now gone to school.
- ~11k in the bank now.
- The coming events will be important to keep the ball rolling! Usually achieve around 30-40k to school each year.

9) Principals report

- Julie shared the design for the teachers' professional learning space! The teachers have had their first official planning session in the new room.
- The room is on the first level in Briarbank above Flasca. There has been painting done, carpet may be done later by the department. The table and layout has been carefully planned to support stage meetings and different types of learning. The space can also be used to host teams from other schools like Glebe and Ultimo for collaboration.
- School Values "Respect Learning Safety" were something raised in 'meet the principal' sessions. Wanting to break down the values into what they mean for the community. Call out to attendees, what words come to mind for Respect, Learning Safety? The plan is to prepare some signage to go up around the school. This is something important for branding and showing what makes our community.
- Assistant Principal role has been advertised to support the new curriculum, it's a part time role for 3 days, but unfortunately no applicants. Julie has decided to fund this role full time, this will be a new advertisement and process through term 4 to fill this role for next year. The role supports the other APs through the school.



- Kate Noble is working on Stage 3 planning for next year and this will include trialling BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) for 2024, note will be coming out shortly.
- Working on a streamlined report for semester 2, partly to do with the new curriculum next year.
- K-2 started a new curriculum this year, finalising plans for 3-6 for next year.

10) Music Committee Report

- Last Friday 1st of September all groups participated in Father's Day BBQ Band Breakfast
- Great atmosphere for the whole school community.
- Parents volunteered their time to run the BBQ and we've sold around 250 bacon and egg rolls.
- We don't have the update on the amount raised, but similar events, such as Mother's Day BBQ
- Band Breakfast raised around \$1200-1500
- The Music Committee will be discussing the use of funds for the purchase of percussion equipment in need of update, as well as service and repair of current instruments.
- As an example, service and repair of 1 flute cost around \$500.00, depending on the work required and we have 6 of them in need of attention.
- The list continues with clarinets, saxophones, trumpets and trombones!
- The Music Committee will meet on Monday 11th of September at 7:15pm in the Music Room.
- The number of students in the program and ensembles are growing this year which is great to see after covid.
- The music program requires a re-vamp and re-structure it is a P&C community run program and that means more community involvement is required to make it successful.
- We would like to acknowledge and thank the parents, Ms. Penny Rees, Principal Julie Warda, and the P&C exec for their support and dedication to music education.

Garth - we have heard from Glebe they were able to raise \$30k using the 3rd party company that incentivized kids via prizes to raise more money. Glebe reported 10% of funds goes on materials, and up to 30% for prizes.

George shared that we did use the 3rd party company a few years ago the first time we did the colour fun run, the experience was that the company takes approx. half the fundraising to cover their expenses and the prizes. Last year permission was granted by the council to use Federal Park.

Agreed to pursue the colour fun run in Term 4. Kerri, George, Joanna to discuss to document the information from last year.
