



# RED-HOT RENEE

She had us all at hello in <u>Jerry Maguire</u>, scored one for singletons everywhere in <u>Bridget Jones's Diary</u>, and floored audiences in her fishnets in <u>Chicago</u>. Now, the awe-inspiring actress explores romantic game-playing in <u>Down With Love</u>. Read on as she chats about dating in Hollywood, her weakness for rock stars, and the one thing she'd dump a guy for.

■ Renée Zellweger is a bona fide movie star—Jerry Maguire, Nurse Betty, and Bridget Jones's Diary are a few résumé highlights—but she acts more like a grammar-school pal. While the point of this Cosmo rendezvous is to get Renée to dish about her upcoming romantic comedy, Down With Love, she's the one throwing out the questions. Some are breezy ("Have you seen Springsteen sing with his wife? And the way he looks at her?"). Others are brainy ("Why do you think negativity is so rampant in the media today?"). It's as if she's waited months for today's gabfest.

And since she's having fun, she doesn't seem to mind swapping dating stories with an acquaintance she's just met (and who's brought along a tape recorder). "This is a treat for me," she says, referring to the fact that most of her interviews as of late have been all business. "I really don't meet people. And when I do, they don't really talk about normal stuff like this."

That probably has something to do with the fact that she just came off an intense publicity campaign for her starring role as Roxie Hart in the award-season darling Chicago. (At press time, her role had won her a Golden Globe for best actress and earned her an Academy Award nomination.) But the levelheaded 33-year-old from Katy, Texas, takes it all in stride.

She has always chosen films for their potential to be "an enriching experience." She did small dramas like A Price Above Rubies and big comedies like Me, Myself, and Irene. Her only formula is not to have one, and the theme continues with her upcoming flicks: this month's satirie sex romp Down With Love and a Civil War drama, Cold Mountain, out Christmas Day.

But as big or small as the project may be, the gossip columnists keep tagging along. During *Bridget Jones*, Renée got more ink for gaining Bridget's extra 20 pounds than for her acting, which was so good, it earned her an Oscar nod. (Renée just signed on for a second *Bridget* and another 20 pounds.) And now that she's slimmed way down, some gossips snipe that she's anorexic. "What you look like is a reflection of a lot of things," Renée says, sighing. "Hard work, happiness, sadness, time off, or an exercise regimen. And for me it might be a reflection of some movie." The rumors clearly bother her.

But when the conversation shifts to love and dating, Renée turns bubbly and



clever. A recent gossip column said that she and George Clooney were "lip locked...at the after-party for *Chicago* in Los Angeles and went home together afterward." Renée simply says, "I have nothing to do with my tabloid image." But she doesn't shy away from the topic either. Maybe she's prepping herself for talk of her new movie?

In Down With Love, she plays a sassy '60s-era Doris Day-like beauty, and Ewan McGregor is her Rock Hudson. Her character, Barbara Novak, believes "if women are more cavalier about sexual relationships, then they won't be as likely to get caught up in men's games," she says. "And [Ewan's character] sets out to prove she's fooling herself." Since Down With Love is all about the roller coaster of love, we decided to talk with Renée about her own views on the saucy subject...

#### Are you more of a hopeless romantic or a realist like your Down With Love character?

I'm an extreme on both ends. Is that possible? I am a hopeless romantic. I believe in love because I've experienced it.

#### What does your inner realist say?

I believe in love, but I'm not sitting around waiting for it. I buy houses. I travel. I take jobs on mountaintops in Transylvania [the Romanian region where Cold Mountain was filmed]. I make decisions based on what I have now, today. Because I know that happiness comes in many ways and if you spend your life hoping to be found by or to find a significant other, you're going to miss out on all that stuff. And that's what makes you special and makes your life rich.

# Sure, but your love life seems pretty rich too. You're becoming known for your celebrity beaus.

Am I? That's crazy to me. I've only dated one [Jim Carrey] for not even a year. And I was in England for half that year.

## Supposedly, you were engaged to him.

I know. The English papers wrote that I was proposed to in a West End restaurant with a ring, and they included the size and cost of the ring. But it was all made up. I'd only been dating him for three months. As if I would consider marriage after only three months!

#### So you've never been engaged?

No. And I have a mythical relationship floating around right now—that's been floating around for a couple of years—that somebody made up and it just snowballed and kept going.

#### You mean George Clooney?

I don't talk about who [laughs]! I'm very good friends with a couple of celebrity men, and I see them a lot. But I haven't dated anybody, and I haven't had a boyfriend since that one [Carrey].

I don't require it. If I meet that best friend that I'm in love with, then sure. But otherwise, no. I do sit back sometimes and wonder about it. My girlfriend [Down With Love costar] Sarah Paulson and I were laughing one day because we couldn't get over how gorgeous Ewan McGregor is. You just die when you see him.

#### He's married, right?

Yes, and he has this beautiful, clever wife and the most beautiful children you've ever seen. They're just to die for. And Sarah and I were like, "Wait a second! What's wrong with us? If a guy is making a list of things he's hoping for in a girl—beautiful, professional, self-sufficient, smart, funny, interesting—where are we on that list?"

## Did you go on more dates before or after you became famous?

Before. Because now no one asks.

#### Why not?

I don't know why [laughs]. I don't say, "Excuse me. I was wondering, has it crossed your mind to invite me to lunch? And if not, why not?" [More laughter]
