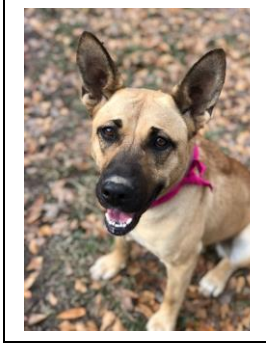
Join Best Friends Animal Society and other compassionate organizations and individuals as we stand up for dogs and cats in our communities and work together to make North Carolina a no-kill state.
