CMS decision – Great News!

CMS has decided to not implement the changes to Medicare Part D formularies that would have limited access to immunosuppressant/organ rejection drugs.

The only notice of the change that I found in our local newspapers was in the Repository on March 14th:

"Administration drops proposed Medicare changes"

WASHINGTON The Obama administration says it's pulling the plug on proposed changes to the Medicare prescription program that ran into strong opposition on Capitol Hill.

Among other changes, the regulation proposed to remove three classes of drugs from a special protected list that guarantees seniors access to a wide selection of critical medications.

The three classes of drugs facing removal were anti-depressants, anti-psychotics and drugs that suppress the immune system to prevent rejection of a transplanted organ.

The administration hoped to save a total of \$729 million by 2019 with the

change, but patient groups including the National Kidney Foundation and the

National alliance on Mental Illness pushed back hard.

Medicare administrator Marilyn Tavenner said Monday in a letter to Congress that the administration will not move forward with the changes.

Akron Canton TRIO CMS activities

Akron Canton member's thoughts on the change were part of the 4000 comments received by CMS on the proposed changes.

Several members contacted our U S
Senators and Representatives. One of
our Senators promised to get to us, but
no response was received. In their
defense, both Ohio Senators signed the
letter to CMS from the Senate Finance
Committee requesting that the Part D
Formulary changes be dropped.

The Area Agency on Aging was contacted and their representative said that the agency planned to comment on the adverse impact of the change on the senior population.

Jewell Cardwell of the Akron Beacon
Journal was contacted. She has
supported the transplant community by
informing her readers of fund raisers to
help with transplant costs. Several Fox
News correspondents were contacted
including two whose family members
have received an organ transplant and
the two doctors from the "Doctors House
Call" segments.
