Partnership More Than a Word

Habitat for Humanity is where the word partnership is more than a word. It is a way of life. It is a description of people helping people. It is driven by a set of values that says we do our best to help people have a better life.

The partnership includes volunteers, board members, local government and their leaders, local merchants, churches, grant organizations, future homeowners and current homeowners. The first part of the partnership includes "building homes". It is the foundation, the well, the septic system, the walls, the roof, the plumbing, electrical work and landscaping. The second part of the partnership is "changing lives." It is families of all ages and sizes coming home to a safe, affordable place to live. It is laying your head down in a room that is yours. Habitat homeowners pay for their homes. The homes are affordable because the volunteer partners do a lot of the work. Habitat also charges 0% on the mortgage so that every dollar goes to lower their debt.
