Habitat for Humanity to be accepting Homeowner Applications in 2024

To qualify for a Habitat home, families are asked to demonstrate their need for shelter, are current residents of Pike County, are able to pay a mortgage with a qualifying family income, and a willingness to partner with our volunteers Families are required to complete 200 hours of "sweat equity" working on their house prior to occupancy.

The Habitat Family Selection Committee will meet with prospective families to review their need for shelter, financial information, etc. in order to select the best candidate for each house. Habitat homeowners are given a 30-year, 0% interest loan to repay Habitat for the cost of the materials and sub-contractors.

The major portion of any Habitat house is built by volunteers who have little or no previous house building experience. Of course we do welcome experienced individuals in all aspects of construction! New volunteers are always needed.

Typically, work is done from Spring through late Fall, on Mondays and Tuesdays from 8 AM to Noon. Instruction is provided and safety is our first priority.

A Word from the Board President:

It is early December, and the cold weather has set in. People are decorating their houses for Christmas and other Holidays. Presents are being purchased and plans are being made to gather around tables filled with seasonal foods and cookies. In most stores there is Christmas music playing. I woke up in a warm comfortable home today and walked into the kitchen to the smell of fresh coffee and sat down to think. I am struck with how blessed I am.

I also considered the story about the birth of Jesus, a child born to a family on the move, forced by a political system, to go to a place away from home, to register for a census. They traveled by foot, perhaps with the help of a beast of burden. A young woman, Mary, was pregnant during this move and I suspect she was physically uncomfortable during this travel time. When they arrive in a small town, there is no normal place for them to stay but they find some shelter in a stable meant for animals and on that very night a baby is born under less-than-ideal conditions. This family's circumstances were not really under their control. They made the best of it. They got a little help from what we call the local innkeeper, and the rest is history.

For those of us who have the honor of working in the Habitat for Humanity community, we see this as a familiar story. Life is not easy for everyone. Circumstances sometimes bring people into situations where they just cannot control even the place where they live. The mission of Habitat is to build decent affordable housing for God's people in need. We do the best we can to build a warm, comfortable, and affordable home for families who simply need a little help. We wish we could do this for every family that is traveling through life with problems beyond their control, but for now, we do what we can, one home, one family at a time. The homes come with an interest free mortgage, a whole lot of volunteer help, a kitchen, a living room, some bedrooms and a bath. The family brings into the home their love, their appreciation, and their future. My thanks to our volunteers, donors, partner families, the board of directors, the Pike County partners and everyone who seeks to make the world a better place by helping one another.
