I. <u>Call to Order</u>

Board President Brad Morgan called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

Board President Brad Morgan led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Consent Agenda

Items marked with an asterisk () are considered routine by the Board of Directors and are enacted in one motion without discussion unless a Board Member or a Citizen requests a specific item to be discussed and voted on separately.

- IV. * Consider and act upon approval of Minutes of October 16, 2023, Meeting.
- V. * Consider and act upon approval of accrued liabilities for October 2023.

Board Member Henry Koehler made the motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Board Member Ken Brawley seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

VI. Citizens to be Heard.

No citizens wished to be heard.

VII. Receive Quarterly Investment Report.

Debi Atkins, Finance Officer, reviewed the Quarterly Investment Report for the Board.

VIII. Consider all matters incident and related to the issuance, sale and delivery of "Greater Texoma Utility Authority Contract Revenue Bonds, Series 2024 (City of Sherman Project)", including the adoption of a resolution authorizing the issuance of such bonds, establishing parameters for the sale and issuance of such bonds and delegating certain matters to authorized officials of the Authority.

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. Garry Kimbell, Specialized Public Finance Inc., provided details. General Manager Paul Sigle is to operate as Pricing Officer for the sale of the Bonds on behalf of the City of Sherman. Board Member Scott Blackerby made the motion to adopt the resolution. Board Member Matt Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

IX.. <u>Consider and act upon Kiewit Water Facilities South Company's Guaranteed Maximum Price D</u>
<u>and Amended Guaranteed Maximum Price C for City of Sherman's South Wastewater Treatment Plant – MBR Project.</u>

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. Kiewit was the only bid received by the City of Sherman. Collin Bunker, Kiewit, provided details. Discussion was held. Board Member Stanley Thomas made the motion to approve the GMP D and amend GMP C, for Kiewit Water Facilities South Co for the South Wastewater Treatment Plant – MBR Project, increasing the contract amount to \$83,362,74.28. Board Member Matt Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

X. <u>Consider and act upon an award of contract for the City of Sherman Water Treatment Plant EDR Rehabilitation Project – EDR Control System.</u>

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. M&M Industrial Control Services, Inc. designs, installs and programs the controls for the Veolia EDR systems. The City is requesting GTUA to enter into an agreement with M&M Industrial Control Services, Inc. to provide the necessary equipment, programming and controls for the WTP EDR Rehab Project for the proposed amount of \$248,500. Board Member Scott Blackerby made the motion to award the contract to M&M Industrial Control Services in the amount of \$248,500.00. Board Member Matt Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

XI. <u>Consider and act upon Change Order No. 1 to the Contract with Veolia Water for City of Sherman, EDR Rehab Project.</u>

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. Veolia is requesting to switch from 650 cell pair to 600 cell pair EDR stacks for the project. The change will reduce the contract price by \$175,000 for a new contract price of \$5,411,970. Board Member Ken Brawley made the motion to approve Change Order No. 1. Board Member Scott Blackerby seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

XII. Consider and act upon Change Order No. 004 to the contract with Landmark Structures for the City of Princeton Elevated Storage Tank Project.

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. Change Order No. 004 is a credit to delete pedestal blast and leave pedestal as is, a decrease of \$7,150.00 resulting in a revised contract amount of \$7,963,754.00. This action would be

contingent upon the City of Princeton's approval. Board Member Ken Brawley made the motion to approve Change Order No. 004. Board Member Stanley Thomas seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

XIII. Consider and act upon Change Order No. 4 to the contract with Underwood, Inc for City of Whitewright Water Distribution System Improvements.

General Manager Paul Sigle provided background information for the Board. Change Order No. 4 would add 171 days to completion. Substantial Completion date November 22, 2023. No change in contract price. Board Member Scott Blackerby made the motion to approve Change Order No. 4. Board Member Ken Brawley seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

XIV. Consider and act upon Administrative Service Contract with the Red River Groundwater Conservation District for 2024.

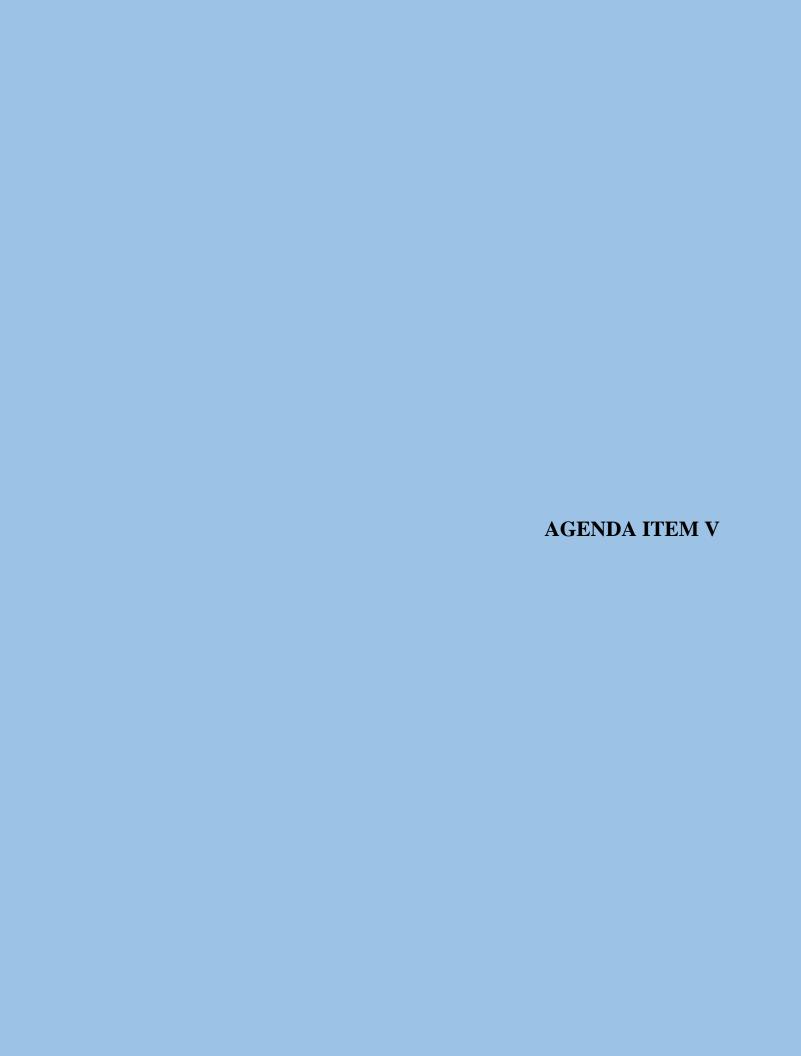

 - GTUA has hired a Senior Accountant. She will be introduced to the Board at the next meeting.





ISSUE

Consider and act upon Kiewit Water Facilities South Company's Guaranteed Maximum Price E - Backfill, F - Underground Piping & Appurtenances, G - Concrete, and H - Electrical Underground for City of Sherman's South Wastewater Treatment Plant - MBR Project.

BACKGROUND

Due to rapid industrial and municipal growth currently being experienced by the City of Sherman, the Wastewater Treatment Plant has to be expanded to meet expected flow and effluent characteristics. Given these characteristics, our engineers recommended a Membrane Biological Reactor (MBR) as the treatment method that will be required to meet the TCEQ requirements. In order to meet the abbreviated timeline, the method of construction delivery chosen was Construction Manager at Risk, or CMAR. Requests for Qualifications (RFQ's) were submitted with three construction firms submitting Statement of Qualifications (SOQ's). The contractor chosen to undertake the new Wastewater Treatment Plant – MBR was Kiewit Water Facilities South, Co. The engineers have undertaken pre-selection of various long lead time equipment to save as much time as possible. Further, the contractor, now procured, is also undertaking pre-procurement to expedite time of delivery.

CONSIDERATIONS

The City of Sherman is requesting the Authority to approve Kiewit Water Facilities South Guaranteed Maximum Price E for Backfill, F for Underground Piping & Appurtenances, G for Concrete, and H for Electrical Underground. The City of Sherman accepted bids for the four bid packages on December 7, 2023 at City Hall and received one bid from Kiewit Water Facilities South Co for Backfill, Underground Piping and Concrete. The City received three bids for the Electrical Underground. The City of Sherman and their engineers evaluated the bids and recommended approving Kiewit for the Backfill and Concrete bid packages and Alterman for the Electrical Underground. The City and the Engineers do not recommend approving Kiewit's bid for Underground Piping.

Based on the Engineer's recommendation, Kiewit is proposing GMP E, G, and H in the amount of \$50,812,403.09 for a total contract price of \$134,175,177.37.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Authority Staff recommends approving the GMP E, G, and H for Kiewit Water Facilities South Co for the South Wastewater Treatment Plant – MBR Project, increasing the contract amount to \$134,175,177.37. This item is contingent upon the City's approval.

The GMP F package includes this amount as well as CMAR fee, Contingency, and CMAR staff needed to execute this early works package with a total amount of \$6,015,353.65.

Kiewit Water Facilities South Co. is hereby submitting GMPE Backfill, GMPG Concrete and GMPH Underground Electrical proposal for the South Wastewater Treatment Plant – MBR Project. This proposal incorporates Bid Package 04-002 Backfill, BP06-001 Concrete and BP07-001 Underground Electrical.

BP06-001 Concrete and Metals was intended to include miscellaneous metals; however miscellaneous metals will be included in BP06-002 expected to be issued by December 22, 2024. BP07-001 Electrical was intended to include Aboveground Electrical; however aboveground electrical will be included in BP07-002 expected to be issued by December 22, 2024.

BP05-001 Underground Piping & Appurtenances was not recommended for approval by the Committee consisting of the City of Sherman, Plummer, and Pape-Dawson. It was requested that we meet to discuss alternatives to address this package as soon as possible. Any delay to awarding the Underground Piping Bid Package could impact schedule and costs as described in COSK-KWT-CMS-LTR-0013.

Kiewit is submitting a total cost for GMPE, GMPG and GMPH in the amount of \$42,398,257.00, which doesn't include Contingency and CMAR Fee. The total amount of this amendment is \$50,812,403.09. This scope is submitted as a lump sum to be billed against the proposed schedule of values. If the overall project schedule changes, this package may require additional funding that would be negotiated via the change management process.

BP04-002 Overview

This scope of work includes: Removal of all shoring from BP04-001 Early Grading, dewatering system for structural excavation areas to allow for backfill placement in dry conditions, installation of a dampproofing system on all structures and compaction and backfill around all structures per the Backfill Package ITB.

The services listed and provided are critical to the CMAR's ability to manage the project per the Contract documents, procedural requirements as outlined in the project management documents, and to satisfy best management practices. Any variation in these services could affect the CMARs ability to manage to the contract documents and best management practices standards.

The CMAR solicited, coordinated, and executed this GMP development per the CMAR Agreement and specifications. The speed of project execution has limited our ability to collaborate in depth but there has been discussion and review of certain scopes during task force meetings.


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Bid Schedule & Results

Only one bidder, Kiewit Water Facilities South Co. submitted a proposal in the amount of \$4,652,000.00. Bid was submitted in a sealed package to the City of Sherman and was evaluated by a committee including the City of Sherman, Pape-Dawson, and Plummer. The committee recommended approval and award to Kiewit Water Facilities South Co..

CMAR support staff for BP04-002 consists of a Grading Superintendent for 26 Weeks (5/1/24 – 11/1/24) has also been included consistent with the positions identified as future scopes on the initial GMP submittals. The cost for support staff is \$416,000. CMAR recommends a GMPE cost of \$5,068,000 (excludes Contingency & CMAR Fee).

30% Cost Model Pricing Comparison

The cost for the proposed GMPE as presented in the 30% Design Cost Model has changed. Revised Drawings were issued with BP04-002, with the following impacts to costs:

- Additional structures now shown and some structures growing in size increasing structural backfill quantities.
- 2. Grading elevations changed affecting structural backfill quantities.
- 3. Updated Geotechnical Report Dated November 15, 2023 modified subgrade improvements for structure over excavations resulting in increased structural backfill quantities due to deeper excavations.

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Figure 2: 30% Cost Model Site Plan





Figure 3: BP04-002 Site Plan


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Bid Schedule & Results

Bid was submitted in a sealed package to the City of Sherman and was evaluated by a committee including the City of Sherman, Pape-Dawson, and Plummer. The committee recommended approval and award to Kiewit Water Facilities South Co..

CMAR support staff for BP06-001 consisting of a Concrete Superintendent and Concrete Field Engineer for 55 Weeks (1/2/24 – 1/23/25) has also been included consistent with the positions identified as future scopes on the initial GMP submittals. The cost for support staff is \$880,000. CMAR recommends a GMPG cost of \$32,311,000 (excludes Contingency & CMAR Fee).

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

- 2. Bioreactor Basins, Preliminary Treatment Unit and Influent Pump Station were some of the structures that increased in size.
- 3. Rebar suppliers had to assume rebar details in cases where there were no structure reinforcement details provided in the drawings resulting in cost increases.
- 4. Concrete suppliers stated the specifications were too stringent, some refused to bid, impacts due to supply and demand, resulting in cost increases.




Figure 4: 30% Cost Model Versus Current Forecast

Anticipated Work Start Date January 1, 2024 and Anticipated Finish Date December 1, 2024.

This scope is submitted as a lump sum to be billed against the proposed schedule of values. If the overall project schedule changes, this package may require additional funding that would be negotiated via the change management process.

BP07-001 Overview

This scope of work includes: Ductbanks, Site Lighting, Manholes, Installation of Owner Furnished Pad Mounted Transformers and Switchgear, Equipment Pads and Grounding per the Underground Electrical Package ITB.

The services listed and provided are critical to the CMAR's ability to manage the project per the Contract documents, procedural requirements as outlined in the project management documents, and to satisfy best management practices. Any variation in these services could affect the CMARs ability to manage to the contract documents and best management practices standards.

The CMAR solicited, coordinated, and executed this GMP development per the CMAR Agreement and specifications. The speed of project execution has limited our ability to collaborate in depth but there has been discussion and review of certain scopes during task force meetings.



Bid Schedule & Results

BP007-01 Underground Electrical was issued for Notice to Bid on November 15, 2023. The Bid Package was due on December 7, 2023. Three bidders submitted a proposal with a Low Bid submitted by JL Texas Construction for a Base Bid in the amount of \$3,458,500.00. Alterman Inc. submitted a Base Bid in the amount of \$4,187,257 (includes bond premium). TIC – The Industrial Company submitted a Base Bid in the amount of \$5,955,800. Bids were submitted in sealed packages to the City of Sherman and were evaluated by a committee including the City of Sherman, Pape-Dawson, and Plummer. The committee recommended approval and award to Alterman Inc.

CMAR support staff for BP07-001 consisting of an Electrical Superintendent and Electrical Field Engineer for 27 Weeks (1/2/24 – 7/12/24) has also been included consistent with the positions identified as future scopes on the initial GMP submittals. The cost for support staff is \$432,000. An allowance was added for UG Electrical Bid Excluded items per Client direction in the amount of \$400,000 to handle exclusions from the recommended Contractor. Allowance will be billed as T&M and any underruns will be credited to the Client and any overruns will be compensable to Owner's Contingency. CMAR recommends a GMPH cost of \$5,019,257 (excludes Contingency & CMAR Fee).

Assumptions and Clarifications

- 1. Within 30 days of notice of award, Subcontractor will need to integrate with project CPM and coordinate with other successful bidders.
- 2. Committee bid recommendation for approval to Alterman accepts Alterman's exclusions.

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- Temp power to support Alterman's scope beyond the 2 spider boxes and 50 foot of cable is excluded.
- b. Spoil relocation from work area excluded in Alterman's scope.
- c. Overtime, expediting, and acceleration fees excluded from Alterman's scope.
- d. Any CMAR support relating to these exclusions or resultant schedule acceleration will be billed as a Time and Materials change by the CMAR against the \$400,000 Allowance established by the Client.

30% Cost Model Pricing Comparison

The cost for the proposed GMPH as presented in the 30% Design Cost Model has no comparable as this is a portion of the scope. At this time it is assumed that eventual total value of GMPH is currently unchanged as the CMAR has not received AG electrical design to evaluate.

Revised Drawings were issued with BP07-001, with the following changes:

- 1. Quantity growth in overall Ductbank footages by 64%:
 - a. Road crossings on MV and Fiber ductbanks, we did not anticipate crossing roads for each MH/Pull point, we anticipated all ductbanks would be on one side of the road.
 - b. Influent Pump Station location changed, moved further south.
 - c. Sludge Storage Tank and Alkalinity Storage areas were added.
- 2. As a result of increased Ductbank footages, excavation, backfill and concrete quantities increased commensurately.
- 3. Setting of owners MV Transformers and Switches included in Underground Electrical Bid Package, including concrete equipment pads.
- 4. Pulling, terminating and testing of MV cable included in Underground Electrical Bid Package.
- 5. Site pole lighting with concrete bases, conduit and wire included in Underground Electrical Bid Package.



Over the past several years, the Board authorized the issuance of open market bonds to construct several projects in the City of Sherman's water and wastewater system. Included in the 2017, 2019 and 2021 open market bond issuances are funds for constructing a new lift station and pipeline which will ultimately serve the Preston Club development, a recently annexed portion of the City of Sherman.

This project includes 8", 12" & 15" sewer lines in the Preston Club Development. 15" and 18" sewer lines extend downstream to a sewer lift station located to serve the area around the intersection of US 82 and SH 289. A 10" sewer force main follows the sewers back through the development and over the ridge line to a short 12" sewer line connecting to an existing Sand Creek 12" Sewer. This project was awarded to Lynn Vessels Construction on May 18th, 2021.

Change Order No. 2 adjusted the as-bid quantities to as-built quantities. These changes were requested by City staff. This change order will also add site cleanup at two sites absorbed by the City per TCEQ requests at Preston Club and High Country subdivisions. Change Order No. 3 added sewer mains to connect to additional lots along Roberts Run in the Preston Club development. Change Order No. 2 and Change Order No. 3 are a \$41,398.85 and \$33,613.93 increase in the contract amount, respectively, yielding a final contract price of \$1,816,753.38.

CONSIDERATIONS

Lynn Vessels Construction, LLC has completed the City of Sherman Northwest Sewer and Force Main Project. Accepting the project as complete will allow the Authority to process the final payment and release the retainage to Lynn Vessels Construction, LLC.

This project includes high head submersible pumps to lift the sewage about 200 vertical feet through over 2 miles of 10" force main. Digital controls and instrumentation are provided for operation of the remote un-maned facility. Communications with the Sherman water treatment plant are included to permit monitoring and operator over-ride from the plant control room when needed. About ½ mile of gravel access road and a 1" water line is included from Naylor Lane. Three phase power service will be extended along the access easement by Grayson Collin Electric Co-op (GCEC) as a separate cost to Sherman.

Bids were opened at the Sherman City Hall on May 11, 2021 and the City received seven (7) bids for the Lift Station Project. Lynn Vessels Construction was awarded the contract in the amount of \$735,517.05.

CONSIDERATIONS

Lynn Vessels Construction, LLC has completed the City of Sherman Northwest Lift Main Project. Accepting the project as complete will allow the Authority to process the final payment and release the retainage to Lynn Vessels Construction, LLC.

The Texas Water Development Board ("TWDB") State Revolving Funds were initially selected as the funding sources for these improvements. However, the TWDB informed the Authority staff in February that changes had been made to the SRF programs by limiting the amount of funding they are making available. The programs are now more difficult to qualify for and will take significantly more time to be funded if a project ends up qualifying. Due to these changes in the SRF program and discussions with TWDB, the Authority staff proposed pursuing funding through the Texas Water Development Fund ("DFund"). The DFund is a state-funded loan program with below-market interest rates. This path forward was approved by the Board in February 2021 and the bond issue closed in July 2022 at which time the City of Bells went out for bids for the Water Meter portion of the project

On March 2nd, the City of Bells received four bids for the City Water Meter Installation Project and Patterson Water Group was the lowest bid with a base bid of \$42,000.

CONSIDERATIONS

Patterson Water Group has completed the City of Bells Water Meter Installation Project. Accepting the project as complete will allow the Authority to process the final payment and release the retainage to Patterson Water Group.

Kevin Ware, the engineer for the City of Valley View contacted the Authority General Manager requesting assistance in obtaining funding for improvements to the District's wastewater system and wastewater treatment plant. These improvements include repair of existing wastewater lines and construction of new wastewater lines, as well as upgrades to the current wastewater treatment plant to reduce the infiltration rate and increase the system capacity to meet TCEQ requirements.

The City of Valley View City Council has requested assistance in obtaining funding for the Wastewater System and Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements Project. After discussing the project with the City of Valley View, Authority Staff has determined that funding through Texas Water Development Board's Texas Water Development Fund (DFund) meets the needs of the City.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The staff recommends that the Board authorize the submission of an application to the TWDB for funds to be used by the Authority for the City of Valley View's Wastewater System and Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements Project in the amount not to exceed \$5,500,000.



ISSUE

Consider and act upon selecting a firm to provide financial advisory services for Greater Texoma Utility Authority Projects.

BACKGROUND

The Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) provides many below-market interest rate loan programs. One of the requirements of many of the TWDB programs is to solicit Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for professional services. When doing so, the TWDB requires the bond recipient to comply with their Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program, which requires applicants and prime contractors to follow steps for procurement.

In the past, the Authority has solicited RFQs for each bond issue through the TWDB. In an effort to save time and money, the TWDB informed the Authority Staff that we could begin to engage professional services for three (3) year terms as opposed to each bond issue. Without soliciting following TWDB guidelines, financial advisory services could be ineligible for payment under the loan funds received. Services would have to be paid for by local funds.

Requests for Qualifications were solicited and received December 6, 2023. Specialized Public Finance was the only company that responded to the Request for Qualifications solicitation.

CONSIDERATIONS

Specialized Public Finance has provided financial advisory services to the Authority since November 2008 and the Authority staff have been very satisfied with the services they have provided.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Authority staff recommends selecting Specialized Public Finance as the firm to provide Financial Advisory services to the Authority.

ISSUE

Consider and act upon selecting a firm to provide bond counsel services for Greater Texoma Utility Authority Projects.

BACKGROUND

The Texas Water Development Board ("TWDB") provides many below-market interest rate loan programs. One of the requirements of many of the TWDB programs is to solicit Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") for professional services. When doing so, the TWDB requires the bond recipient to comply with their Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program, which requires applicants and prime contractors to follow steps for procurement.

In the past, the Authority has solicited RFQs for each bond issue through the TWDB. In an effort to save time and money, the TWDB has informed the Authority Staff that we could begin to engage professional services for three (3) year terms as opposed to each bond issue. Without soliciting following TWDB guidelines, bond counsel services could be ineligible for payment under the loan funds received. Services would have to be paid from local funds.

Requests for Qualifications were solicited and ultimately received on December 6, 2023. Norton Rose Fulbright was the only company that responded to the Request for Qualifications solicitation.

CONSIDERATIONS

Norton Rose Fulbright is the Authority's current bond counsel and has provided bond counsel services to the Authority since our creation. The Authority continues to be very satisfied with the services they have provided.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Authority staff recommends selecting Norton Rose Fulbright as the firm to provide bond counsel services to the Authority.

<u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON A POLICY FOR GENERAL MANAGER</u> APPROVING CHANGE ORDERS.

ISSUE

Discuss a policy for the amount of a change order that does not require Board approval.

BACKGROUND

At the November Board meeting, The Board asked about a policy to allow the General Manager to approve certain change orders on the behalf of the Board of Directors. The Authority occasionally receive requests for change orders that do not change or increase the price of the contract.

CONSIDERATIONS

The Board could choose to create a policy allowing the General manager to approve a change order that does not increase the contract price or a change order that does not increase more than a set amount. The City of Sherman policy allows the City Manager to approve a change order up to a \$50,000 increase.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Authority staff recommends selection one of the options to allow the General Manager to approve certain change order on the behalf of the Board.
