

**Greater Texoma Utility Authority/City of Bells Wastewater System Improvements Project  
Request for Qualifications for Engineering**

Greater Texoma Utility Authority/City of Bells is seeking qualification statements for engineering services for the design of improvements to wastewater system to include wastewater treatment plant rehabilitation.

**Scope of Work:** 1) Design of wastewater treatment plant improvements; 2) Design of wastewater collection system improvements; 3) Preparation of all required Texas Water Development Board documents; 4) Preparation of bid packages and assistance with project bidding; and 5) Preparation of any applicable permit(s).

**Statement of Qualifications (SOQ):** Furnish an SOQ to include the following information: 1) Experience with design of Wastewater Systems; 2) Project team and project team resumes; 3) Experience with TWDB funded projects; 4) Experience with construction phase engineering services for wastewater systems; 5) Experience in the design/construction services in the North Texas/Bells area; and 6) List of references with contact information.

**Submission Requirements:** If your firm is interested in being considered for this assignment, submit your SOQ to General Manager, Greater Texoma Utility Authority, 5100 Airport Drive, Denison TX 75020 (US Mail and delivery) (903-786-4433) no later than 3:00PM on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Seven (7) hard copies and one (1) digital copy of the SOQ must be submitted. Each statement should be limited to no more than 10 pages including the cover letter.

**Selection Criteria/Negotiation:**

If an acceptable contract cannot be negotiated, City may formally end negotiations and begin negotiating with the next highest qualified person or firm.
