Request for Qualifications for Engineering Services

Greater Texoma Utility Authority, on behalf of the City of Whitewright, is seeking qualifications for engineering services for the design of wastewater system improvements, to include rehabilitation of the City's wastewater treatment plant.

Scope of Work: 1) Design of new wastewater system improvements, including rehabilitation of the existing wastewater treatment plant and necessary appurtenances as determined during design; 2) Permit amendment; 3) Assistance with the preparation of all required Texas Water Development Board documents; 4) preparation of bid packages and assistance with project bidding; 5) On-site construction observation during construction with technical training & technical supervision of daily inspector, construction administration, and contract coordination with TWDB; and 6) Coordination with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

<u>Statement of Qualifications (SOQ):</u> Furnish an SOQ to include the following information: 1) Experience with design of wastewater systems, including wastewater treatment plants; 2) Project team and project team resumes; 3) Experience with TWDB funded projects; 4) Experience with construction phase engineering services for wastewater systems; 5) Experience in the design/construction services in the North Texas area; and 6) List of references with contact information.

Ten (10) hard copies and one (1) digital copy of the SOQ must be submitted. Each statement should be limited to no more than 10 pages including the cover letter.

Minimum Qualifications and Selection Criteria

The City of Whitewright will evaluate the proposals to determine which firm has the best qualifications.

Contract Terms and Negotiation Schedule

The consultant for engineering services is expected to negotiate an agreement for services that is acceptable to the City of Whitewright. If an acceptable contract cannot be negotiated, the City of Whitewright may formally end negotiations and begin negotiating with the next highest qualified person or firm.

This contract is contingent upon release of funds from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). Any contract or contracts awarded under this Request for Qualifications (RFQ) are expected to be funded in part by a loan from the TWDB. Neither the State of Texas nor any of its departments, agencies or employees are or will be a party to this RFQ, or any resulting contract. RFQs are issued in accordance with Section 2254 of the Texas Government Code (Professional Services Act).

This contract is subject to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program, which includes EPA-approved fair share goals toward procurement of Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise (M/WBE) businesses.
