She started acting with a supporting role in Maid in Manhattan, directed by Wayne Wang. Known best for the lead role "Rita" in Grown Ups. starring Adam Sandler, Di created and starred in the first Asian American dramedy television show to air (PBS). A new director, but an actor and voice talent for 20 years, she teaches translating theatre training for film and television and is committed to raising marginalized voices.



Sofia Ruiz graduated from UT Austin with a BA in Theatre & Dance. A professional actor for 10 years, she has worked in plays, films, TV, and voice over projects. Her most recent role is the recurring character "Mónica" in AppleTV's comedy, Acapulco. Her podcast about the acting industry in Mexico was the first Spanish-language podcast of its kind. Her short film script was a semi-finalist in Sundance's Tableread My Screenplay, then toured the festival circuit worldwide. She and her partner moved to Athens from Mexico City to start her MFA program.
