The Marriage That Restored Peace to Europe in 1420

Beginning in 1337, the 100 Years' War was a grueling conflict between France and England, which spanned for over a century—hence the name. However, there was a brief period of peace that was a result of the uniting of their thrones through marriage. In 1420, at the beginning of the 83rd year of their dispute, a marriage was arranged between Catherine of Valois and Henry V of England. This marriage gave England an heir to the French throne, temporarily bringing an end to the conflict. Although this marriage was a diplomatic solution to the conflict, some historians will argue that there was more than just politics behind their marriage. Many gestures and public displays of affection that the two made towards each other suggested a deeper, more affectionate side of their marriage. However, after Henry V passed away just 2 years later, and France had regained control of their throne, the war resumed for another 33 years.



Celebrating African American Pioneers: Garett Morgan

Garett Morgan was born on March 4th, 1877, in Paris, Kentucky. Even though Garett was African American he was not enslaved in this period because both of his parents were freed. When he was young, he moved to Cincinnati and worked as a handyman and as a tailor. Growing up he had a creative mind and patented many things such as the protective hood which turned into the Modern Gas Mask, the hair straightener, and the traffic signal. He was also a major civil rights activist for African Americans. He was a member of NAACP (National Association for the advancement of Colored People) which advocated for the rights of African Americans. Garett also started a weekly newspaper called "The Cleveland Club." He passed away on July 27, 1963, with his legacy still being used throughout our society. The traffic lights he makes are used in our everyday lives, and people still use the hair straightener he created. If not for him, society would be long behind.

On January 29th at around 8:47pm our nation was shaken with a tragedy when an American Airlines Regional flight collided with a U.S Army Black Hawk helicopter over the Potomac River near Washington National Airport. The alleged 60 passengers and 4 crew members of the flight alongside the 3 occupants of the helicopter all met a untimely demise. 
