The sessions will run from 2-4 PM on Wednesday, March 17^{th,} and 7-9 PM on Thursday, March 18th. Members may sign up for one or both; both are included in your registration fee.

Content Descriptions

How to create experiences WITH children rather than planning activities FOR them:

In the field of early childhood education, the focus has often been on planning an activity FOR children that is focused on coming up with a product or focused on information. This session presented by author, consultant, and DAP expert, Jacky Howell, will help you and your staff members experience a shift in thinking about creating experiences that are meaningful, engaging, and interactive.

Goals include:

- The reasons why creating experiences *WITH* children leads to meaningful play and learning.
- How to develop experiences that are dynamic and connective learning opportunities aligned with developmentally appropriate practice.
- How experiences can promote development, align with practice, and engage children in higher order thinking.

Understanding and Counteracting Implicit Bias:

Even with our awareness of stereotyping and our genuine attempts to avoid bias, our hidden assumptions about other people can affect the way we treat them. Recent studies that explore the concept of implicit bias help explain why this may happen. Through a mix of short presentations about social science research, as well as activities and discussions, we will explore some harmful side effects of how our brains naturally perceive, categorize, and draw inferences about other people. We will also examine when this kind of bias is most likely to influence our actions and decisions, and begin to understand how young children develop biases. We will discuss practical steps to try to counter the negative effects of implicit bias in early childhood classrooms, child care settings, and organizations.

Brief Biography of Presenters

Jacky Howell, MA, has over 45 years' experience as an early childhood teacher, consultant, coach, and administrator. In addition, she has over 30 years' experience as a course instructor and presenter on topics related to early childhood development and curriculum. She is a published author with her book, *Rituals and Traditions: Fostering a Sense of Community in Preschool.* She has published many articles in early education journals. She received her Master's degree in Human Development from Pacific Oaks College and is a certified OSSE trainer. Currently she is a consultant and presenter with her own business, <u>Azspire</u> and works with a variety of programs in the DC Metro Area as well as across the country. She has done webinars, and workshops and presentations locally and nationally. Jacky believes strongly that all children deserve the highest quality early childhood experience and strives to work with others in creating places worthy of young children, families, and staff.

Emily Ederer, MA, founded the <u>Silver Spring Day School Training Institute</u> to provide innovative, Maryland approved, Core of Knowledge training for early childhood educators. Calling on years of experience as a Pre-K teacher and research into the most current ideas in child development, she offers active, innovative workshops that give providers new ways of looking at their work and practical techniques they can use in their workplaces immediately. In addition, she offers coaching for area teachers for Maryland's new Children Study Their World Curriculum through the University of Maryland. In her role as Director of Training and Administration at SSDS, she coordinates staff development and offers activities that enrich the experience of students, families and staff.

Credit Hours and Core of Knowledge Area

Attendance at one of the two-hour virtual presentations on March 17th and/or 18th will earn members 2 Core of Knowledge credit hours. Attendance at both sessions will earn 4 COK hours. "Implicit Bias" is in the COK area of Professionalism, and "How to create experiences..." is in the areas of Curriculum (1 hour) and Child Development (1 hour). In accordance with MSDE regulations, members must attend the full 2-hour virtual presentation, and complete a content assessment and presenter evaluation before receiving their certificate. Requirements by MSDE also stipulate that members from MD must pass the assessment with a score of 70% or higher. Further details about completing the assessment will be covered at the pre-PDD business meeting. Personalized certificates will be available at the <u>conclusion</u> of the Professional Development Days, also in compliance with MSDE regulations.

Registration

Registration for the Spring virtual training course is online via SignUpGenius. Click on the <u>link</u> and complete the form. Please sign up individually to ensure your email is recorded. Note also that there are two time slots to choose from - Wednesday, March 17th from 2-4 PM; and Thursday, March 18th from 7-9 PM.

Registration should be submitted by **Friday, March 5th.** Don't forget to renew your PACT membership before signing up for the workshops!

How to log on for the virtual course

A Zoom link will be e-mailed to registered members 24 hours prior to each session. Please click the link to your session at least 15 minutes early to check audio/video, sign in, and hear announcements from PACT. To earn a certificate for attendance, you must join the session by the start time, sign your name in the chat box, and follow the links to the assessment and feedback forms provided at the end of the presentation. Once signed in, participants' names will appear in the chat box. Registrants may be required to sign-in periodically to demonstrate their continuous participation. If a member leaves the session for a brief break, they will need to sign in again.

Assessments and Evaluations

Participants will be asked to complete a content assessment and presenter evaluation of the virtual course via a Google form. A link to the survey will be provided on the Zoom chat room at the conclusion of the course. The link will also be e-mailed to participants following the

PDD, and should be completed within 24 hours. MSDE requirements stipulate that members from Maryland must pass the assessment with a score of 70% or higher.

Certificates

Participants who attend the entire virtual course and who have completed the Google docs form for assessments and evaluations will be e-mailed their personalized certificate in PDF form.

Award for Devoted Service in Early Childhood Education
