- In the event of the Junior League Match Secretary receiving written complaints about—
 - (a) players attending late for matches
 - (b) delay in the start of any match

the alleged offenders shall be asked for their written comments and if the explanation given is not considered satisfactory, the matter shall be referred to the League Match Committee for their decision.

- 14. The League Match Committee, to which the Junior League Match Secretary shall be co-opted, shall deal with any matter not provided for by these Regulations and shall be the sole authority for the interpretation thereof.
- 15. Any Captain shall have the right to appeal to the League Executive Committee on any matter and any such appeal or application hereunder shall be dealt with in such manner as the Executive Committee may determine and their decision shall be final.

JUNIOR LEAGUE COMPETITION - REGULATIONS

- Annual entry fee to the Junior League shall be 50 np per team to be paid to the Junior League Match Secretary before the first match is played and there will be no further charge to teams or clubs.
- 2 A senior member of each club or organisation entering a team in the Junior League shall be nonplaying Captain of the junior team.
- The name and address of each team Captain, together with a list of juniors from whom the club or organisation will select its junior team must be sent to the Junior League Match Secretary before lst October.

(It is appreciated that there may be additions to junior teams).

- Each junior team shall consist of 2 boys and 2 girls under 16 at midnight on 30th August/1st September who have not played more than two times for any team in the third or higher division in the S.A.B.L. during the current or past season.
- Each match shall consist of 1 Boys' Double, 1 Girls' Double and 2 Mixed Doubles and each event shall be one game of 21
- Points for matches won and drawn shall be awarded as in the S.A.B.L.
- Clubs entering more than one team shall rank them
 2, etc.
- Players may not play for more than one team per season except in accordance with Regulation 9
- Transfers may only be allowed with the written agreement of both team Captains. No player may play for two or more teams on the same day. Only one transfer per season is allowed.
- 10. No club shall have the right to object to the transfer of any player except where the player is not clear on the books of the objecting club in respect of monies outstanding.
- Any club playing an ineligible player shall, at the discretion of the Junior League Match Secretary, forfeit all games and points won by that player while he or she was ineligible.
- 12. (a) There shall be no floaters.
- (b) There shall be no substitutes.

- (b) shall determine the date by which entries, accompanied by entry fees, shall be in the hands of the Tournaments Secretary;
- (c) shall arrange the seeding, handicapping and draw;
- (d) shall direct when and where matches shall be played and the disposal of the results;
- (e) shall arrange the finals;
- (f) shall determine the prizes to be awarded;
- (g) may delegate their authority to such sub-committee as they see fit;
- (h) shall have the power to refuse the entry of anyone who, in its opinion, is too good a player for the "B" or "C" Tournament;
- (i) shall have the power to cancel any event in the "B", "G" or "V" Tournaments if, in its opinion, the entry is not sufficient to warrant the event. Five events shall be played in the "A" Tournament;
- (j) shall deal with any matter not provided for by these regulations and shall be the sole authority for the interpretation thereof.

INSURANCE

All registered members of the League are insured by the League and any claims or enquiries should be made to the Hon. League Treasurer. Claims must be made within one week after the happening of any event which may give rise to a claim.

INDIVIDUAL TOURNAMENTS REGULATIONS

 (a) At its first meeting each season, the Executive Committee shall consider organising the following tournaments restricted to League members and veteran players who reside locally:-

Tournament A — Open
Tournament B — Moderate Players

Tournament C — Restricted Moderate
Players Handicap (restricted to moderate players in the third and lower divisions)

Tournament V - Veterans Handicap.

(b) Each tournament, unless decided otherwise by the Executive Committee, shall consist of:-

Men's singles Ladies' singles Men's doubles Ladies' doubles Mixed doubles

- All tournaments shall be run, as far as is practical, in accordance with the B.A. of E's regulations for tournaments and recommendations to tournament committees.
- (a) All players registered with the League shall be eligible to enter the open tournament.
 - (b) Players shall be seeded in the open tournament.
 - (c) All players registered with the League shall be eligible to enter the Moderate Players Tournaments except those:-

(i) who have been awarded county colours

(ii) who, during the current or past season, have played on more than one occasion for a county first or second team. but including past county players now authorised but the LCRA to take part in moderate players.

but including past county players now authorised by the LCBA to take part in moderate players tournaments.

- (d) Veteran competitors shall conform to the following criteria:-
 - (i) gentlemen: 45 years and over before the tournament closing date.

(ii) ladies: 40 years and over before the tournament closing date.

- Entry shall be on forms obtainable from the Tournaments Secretary.
- Unless decided otherwise by the Executive Committee, matches shall consist of games of 15 aces (ladies' singles 11 aces), the side first winning two games being the winner.
 - 6. The Executive Committee:-
 - (a) shall determine the entry fees per player per event;

SEASON 1970/71

A disappointing season for Southport in the Littlewood Cup who, after last season's successes, found anno domini by far their toughest opponent this season and managed to record only one victory. The talent to replace players in Southport's senior side is slow to mature and means the old guard will probably have to soldier on for another season or two.

Southport II found the going too hard in Division Two and have been relegated again after their one season of promotion.

The brightest hopes appeared with the introduction of a youthful third team who performed ably and may well fill gaps in Scuthport's senior side in seasons to come.

Jenny Pearson and Eric Usher were once again ever present in the Lancashire county side and both had good results in the Lancashire Open and Restricted tournaments.

The Southport League was invited to stage two county matches and the Drill Hall provided an attractive venue for a beginning of the season friendly match with Essex and a much sterner tussle against West of Scotland who went on to reach the final of the intercounty competition.

In the Southport League, Hawks once more were undefeated but had a close-run thing in an end-of-season match when St. Peter's held them to a draw. Southbank Road retained the Hackney Cup but disappointed in the challenge round of the Hudson Cup which was won by Hawks.

Having struggled to beat Woodvale by 4 points after an 8-all draw in the preliminary round of the St. Paul's Cup, Leyland Road went on to win this knock-out competition in fine style which included a 9-7 victory over Sacred Heart in the semi-final and victory in the final by a similar score against St. Peter's II.

Park II played well to their handicap to win the Fleetwood Hesketh Shield and, in particular, their fine win against generously handicapped Tarleton in the semi-final should not be forgotten when congratulating the team on beating the strong but heavily handicapped Hawks team in the final.

The League Shield remains with the Amateurs club through the efforts of their third team who beat Teachers in an entertaining final.

The Leggue tables, which follow on page 11, speak for themselves and our congratulations go to all promoted teams.

- 3.-(a) Matches shall be played by teams consisting of three ladies and three men, playing five mixed doubles events, two ladies' doubles events and two men's doubles events, each event to consist of one game of twenty-one aces. In each team two men and two ladies to form two mixed couples who shall play both the opposing couples in the other team. The remaining two players to form a third mixed couple who shall play the corresponding couple in the other team only. The man from the third mixed couple is to play in turn with each of the other two men, and the two men's couples so formed are to play the corresponding couples in the other team only. The lady from the third mixed couple is to play in turn with each of the other two ladies, and the two ladies' couples so formed are to play the corresponding couples in the other team only.
 - (b) The order of play shall be as follows :--

- (ii) Gentlemen's Doubles and Ladies' Doubles shall be at the discretion of the official in charge (or the home team captain).
- 4.—(a) Not later than the 21st November each year each Club Secretary must send to the Hon. Cup and Shield Secretary a list of players (not exceeding five ladies and five gentlemen) from which each team in the competition shall be chosen.
- (b) No players shall be nominated for more than one team in the competitions.
- (c) A player, other than a player nominated in accordance with rule 14 (f) (ii) of the League Rules, having played during the current season three or more times for a team in either the first or second divisions shall be debarred from playing in the League Shield Competition.
- The League Executive shall arrange the finals on neutral courts unless mutually agreed otherwise.
- 6.—Any matter not provided for by these rules shall be dealt with by the Executive Committee who shall also be the sole authority for the interpretation thereof.

RULES OF ELIMINATION COMPETITIONS FOR THE HUDSON CUP, THE HACKNEY CUP AND THE ST. PAUL'S CUP

 (a) All clubs shall be given free entry to the Hudson Cup Competition.

(b) All clubs in the second and lower divisions shall be given free entry to the St. Paul's Cup Competition.

 All players taking part in the competition must be registered members of the League.

3.—Matches shall be played in the same manner as League Matches. In the case of a tie the match shall be replayed on the court of the team playing away in the original match. In the case of a further tie, the two captains of the two tying teams shall toss a coin to decide the choice of court for the next replay.

 (a) No player shall play for more than one team in the competitions.

(b) Clubs in the second and lower divisions may play the same players in both competitions.

 The League Executive Committee shall arrange the finals on neutral courts unless it is mutually agreed otherwise.

6.—The team that qualifies to challenge the holders of the Hudson Cup shall be the holders of the Hackney Cup for that season.

7.—Any matter not provided for by these rules shall be dealt with by the Executive Committee who shall also be the sole authority for the interpretation thereof.

RULES OF HANDICAP ELIMINATION COMPETITIONS FOR THE FLEETWOOD-HESKETH SHIELD AND THE LEAGUE SHIELD

1.—(a) All teams in the first and second divisions of the League shall be given free entry to The Fleetwood-Hesketh Shield Competition.

(b) All teams in the third and lower divisions of the League shall be given free entry to The League Shield Competition.

All players taking part in the competitions must be registered members of the League. The League Rules have been revised and rewritten and, having been approved by general meeting, are included in this handbook.

The greatest success of the season was the Highton Junior Cup competition played during one afternoon at the Drill Hall and the seventy or eighty youngsters who took part provided a spectacle that was its own reward for the organisers of this competition which had been allowed to wilt in recent seasons. Following the success of the Highton Cup the resuscitation of the Junior League is a major objective in the coming season.

Joining the League for Season 1971/72 are five new clubs plus five more teams from clubs already in the League and for the first time the League will consist of six divisions. To all new clubs and teams we wish a warm welcome and hope that they enjoy our League match play.

7.-FINANCE

- The financial year of the League shall end on 31st March.
- B. Annual subscriptions shall be paid by 1st October in each League year.
- C. Any member whose subscription remains unpaid after 1st October in each year shall be liable to penalty, suspension, or forfeiture of membership at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
- D. All monies due to the League shall be deemed to be owing to the League Hon. Treasurer.
- E. The rate of subscription shall be:-
 - (i) League entrance fee £2.00.
 - (ii) Annual subscription per club £2.00.
 - (iii) Private members annual subscription £0.25.
- F. The rate of registration shall be:-
 - Bulk registration per team £1.25 plus whatever shall be the relevant insurance premium per registered player between the ages of 16 and 65.
 - (ii) Individual registration per player £0.25 to include any relevant insurance premium.
- G. Application to transfer fee £0.25.

8.-APPEALS

Any club or player shall have the right to appeal to the Executive Committee on any matter and any such appeal or other application hereunder shall be dealt with in such manner as the Executive Committee may determine and their decision shall be final.

9.-RULES

Any matter not provided for by these rules shall be dealt with by the Executive Committee, who shall also be the sole authority for the interpretation thereof, provided that any decision given by a General Meeting shall be binding. Any addition to, or interpretation of, these rules made by the Executive Committee shall only be operative until the next Annual General Meeting of the League when they shall be reported to such meeting for confirmation or otherwise. No amendment or alteration to these rules shall be made except at a General Meeting.

6.-GENERAL MEETINGS

- (a) The Annual General Meeting of the League shall be held in the month of April on a day and at place and time appointed by the Executive Committee for the adoption of the Executive Committee report and audited accounts, any alterations to rules, the election of officers and the Executive Committee as required under Rule 4, the election of the Hon. Auditor, and such other business as may be transacted in general meeting.
- (b) All items to be placed on the agenda of the Annual General Meeting, including nominations for office and for the Executive Committee, shall be sent in writing to the Hon. Gen. Secretary so as to reach him not later than 28th February in the same year.
- (c) Not less than 14 days notice of any general meeting shall be given. Written notification to each affiliated club secretary, which shall include the agenda for the meeting and a copy of the audited accounts, shall be deemed to be sufficient notice of the Annual General Meeting.
- (d) An Extraordinary General Meeting shall be convened upon a resolution of the League executive or at the written request to the Hon. Gen. Secretary of not less than 20 members being representative of at least 6 member clubs. Such requests shall state the purpose for which the meeting is required and no other business shall be transacted. The meeting shall be held within one month of such requisition being received by the Hon. Gen. Secretary and the notice and agenda shall be circulated to all member club secretaries at least 14 days in advance.
- (e) Accidental omission to give the required notice to any Club Secretary shall not invalidate the proceedings at a general meeting.
- (f) All registered players of the League shall be entitled to attend and vote at any general meeting of the League.
- (g) Voting shall be by show of hands unless any 6 persons present, and entitled to vote, demand a ballot.
 - (h) No member may vote by proxy.
- (i) No individual may have more than one vote, except the chairman of the meeting who shall have a casting vote.
- (j) At all General Meetings 20 members entitled to vote shall form a quorum.
 (k) If there is no quorum for:-
 - (i) an Extraordinary General Meeting, the motion(s) on the agenda shall be deemed to have been defeated and the meeting concluded.
 - (ii) an Annual General Meeting, it shall be adjourned and another notification shall be circulated without a time restriction. At the adjourned meeting the members present shall form a quorum.

- (xvi) Registration fees shall accompany each registration form.
- (xvii) Any player having registered for one club and wishing to play in League matches for another club during the same season may apply to the Executive Committee for a transfer to the last mentioned club. A form of application to transfer must be purchased from the Hon. Match Secretary at a fee of 25p and must be duly completed and deposited with the Hon. Match Secretary not less than seven days before the first match in which the player intends to play for his or her new club. The player shall not play for the new club until he or she receives written notification from the Hon. Match Secretary that the transfer has been completed.
- (xviii) No club shall have the right to object to the registration of any player with another club except where the player is not clear on the books of the objecting club in respect of monies outstanding. Any club wishing to object under this clause must locge such objection in writing, giving full particulars, with the League Secretary. The suspension by the Executive Committee of any registration under this rule shall be operative only until the defaulting player shall have discharged his or her obligations to the objecting club.

(x x) FLOATERS.

- (a) Where a club has more than one team, whether in the same or different divisions, a player having played in a club team on more than one occasion is thereby debarred from playing in any lower ranked club team.
- 1. However:
 1. the Executive Committee may transfer such
 a player from one team to another on
 application being made for that purpose
 under 5.C. xvii, but only one transfer shall
 oe allowed in a season in respect of such
 a player.
- 2. a Club shall have the right to nominate to the Executive Committee before 1st October the names of one lady and one gentleman from their lower team or from each of their lower teams and, upon being approved by the Executive Committee, these players shall not during that season be subject to the provisions of this rule. Such players shall be known as floaters and may only float up.
- (c) The decision of the Executive Committee regarding any application under b.1. or nomination under b.2. above shall be final.
- (c) Any club playing an ineligible player shall, at the discretion of the Executive Committee, forfeit all games and points won by that player while he or she was ineligible.

(vi) (a) All matches shall be played under the laws of badminton, and in the particular week appointed by the Executive Committee, unless written permission to re-arrange a match has been obtained from the Hon. Match Secretary.

(b) applications to re-arrange a match, giving full reasons therefor, must be in writing and delivered to the Hon. Match Secretary.

(vii) The home club shall have the sole right to decide on which night during the appointed week the match shall be played and shall give at least fourteen days written notice thereof to the visiting club.

(viii) All matches shall commence not later than 7 p.m. and the actual time of starting shall be marked accurately on the score sheet.

(ix) The home club shall give fourteen days written notice to the visiting club of which events it desires to play at 7 p.m. and 7-15 p.m. respectively and it shall be the duty of each club to ensure that its players in such two events are available for play at the times stated.

(x) The order of play in all events shall be in accordance with the requirements of the home captain.

(xi) In the event of any delay arising in the commencement of any match the reason therefor shall be entered on the back of the score sheet and signed by both captains. In any such event the Executive Committee

(a) may require both captains to appear before the Committee for the purpose of explaining the delay.

(b) may impose on the club found to be at fault such fine or penalty as the committee may in their absolute discretion deem adequate.

(xii) No player selected to play in a particular match shall be eligible to play in the match unless he or she is present and ready to play by 8-15 p.m.

- (xiii) If it shall appear to the Executive Committee that any player has habitually attended late for matches (as to which the Committee shall be the sole judges) the Committee shall have power to call the player before them and if they so decide:-
 - to suspend the player from all League and other matches for such a period as the Committee may determine, and/or
 - (b) to impose upon the player such a fine as the Committeee may deem adequate.

(xiv) Nylon shuttles may be used in matches on giving 14 days prior notice and by mutual consent.

(xv) All players participating in League competitions must be registered with the League. For registration, each club secretary shall send on the form provided a list of club players to the Hon. Treasurer before the first match of each season. Additional players may be registered, on individual registration forms, within three days of participating in a match.

- (ii) Application for membership to the League for any year must be delivered in writing to the Hon. Gen. Secretary not later than the 30th day of April preceding the year concerned. First applications must be accompanied by the prescribed entrance fee.
- (iii) An annual subscription shall be paid by each member club.

B. Structure

- The League shall consist of such one or more divisions as the Executive Committee shall determine.
- (ii) The Executive Committee shall form each division at its first meeting.

C. Competition

- (i) The team securing most points in each division shall be the champion team of that division and shall be entitled to the custody of the championship trophy of that division until the succeeding 30th April.
- (ii) The two teams at the head of the second and lower divisions shall be promoted to the next higher division, and the team or teams at the foot of each division may be relegated to the next lower division. This shall always apply except when the divisions are reconstituted by the Executive.
- (iii) In deciding questions of championship, promotion or relegation, where two or more teams secure the same number of points, the number of games won shall be the deciding factor.

(iv) Each court shall have a minimum playing standard as decided by the Executive Committee.

(v) (a) each match shall consist of four mixed doubles, two men's doubles, two ladies' doubles, and each event shall consist of two games of 15 aces. No player may play more than one like event in the same match,

(b) points shall be awarded as follows:-3 points for a win on games irrespective of

aces
2 points for a tie on games and a win on aces
1 point for a tie on games and a tie on aces
2 point for a tie on games and a loss on aces.

 (c) pairs must be played in order of strength,
 (d) captains must complete their teams on the match score sheet before the start of the match.

(e) In the event of any player being incapacitated, after play in a match has begun, so that he or she cannot continue playing, a captain shall be entitled to include a substitute in any subsequent games in which the incapacitated player should have taken part provided that the injury or other incapacity was caused entirely after play in the match had begun and was not due solely to tiredness or the worsening of an existing ailment.

 (ii) The officers shall be elected at the Annual
 General Meeting.

age limit of 21 years (d) individuals, known as private members, who shall:-

(i) pay an annual subscription (ii) receive copies of all League circulars

(iii) be eligible to attend League general meetings

(iv) be eligible to vote and hold office (e) Honorary Life Members.

Individual members of individual clubs and associations are ipso facto indirect members of the League.

4.—ADMINISTRATION

(i) The management of the League shall be vested in an Executive Committee consisting of:-

(a) the officers of the League

(b) nine other members to be elected at the Annual General Meeting, three of whom shall retire each year in rotation.

(ii) Six members shall form a quorum at any com-

mittee meeting.

(iii) All retiring members of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election.

(iv) The Officers of the League upon retirement from office shall be ex officio members of the Executive Committee for one year unless the Executive Committee shall otherwise decide.

(v) The Chairman shall have a casting vote at all


