Topics of Discussion:	

Expressed gratitude for a good turnout. Explained that our outgoing president, Alyson Shahwan, was not present due to a family matter. He said how much the Board appreciates Alyson's service as president this past year and commended her for the graphics design work on multiple announcements for the neighborhood.

Finances – Dan Davidson

An independent audit has been performed to verify the accounting books. It appears that the schedule of outflows will coincide with the projected inflows to where we might not have to touch our reserves. The flowerbed project will exhaust most of the checking account funds and will need to be built back up over the next couple of years.

Membership and Outreach - David Brawand

Over the last few years SCN membership has fluctuated between 40 - 45%. David would like to see us reach at least 50% participation. A key is each member encouraging their own neighbors to participate. We encourage membership payments to be made early in the calendar year. This assists with SCN cash flow and simplifies further collection efforts during the year.

Projects:

Security Cameras – Scott Ares

Electrical work was completed in January and security cameras were installed in February to both main entrances. Concern was raised about what the cameras were capturing. It was discovered that after adjusting the cameras they were recording the lower half of the windows on 3639 Waynoka. An adjustment was made to shield those windows from view. Another set of cameras will be installed in the back alleyway of Waynoka between Stone Creek Estates and the neighboring community where cars can enter Stone Creek Estates. A final set of cameras will be placed in areas where problems have been reported. These cameras will be attached to a pole that can be easily installed in any backyard where the cameras can access traffic in alleyways.

90 / 10 Sidewalk Grant Program – Scott Ares

A new canvasing of the neighborhood will occur in February to identify houses where the sidewalks were repaired and which sidewalks were not yet repaired. Notices will be sent to home owners to inform them of the 90 / 10 Sidewalk Grant Program.

Entrance Beautification – Marty Michael

Cost estimates are a lot closer to what can be expected and the estimate has gone down by nearly \$3,000. This includes a miscellaneous category of \$1,000 to cover unexpected costs. The schedule of activities to overhaul the entrances are as follows:

- March 2. Volunteers from the Denton County Master Gardeners plus Manuel, March, and Marty will remove the existing plants, soakers, and weed barrier at the Rosemeade and Old Denton entrances.
- April 3 Complete work on Old Denton plus add compost and soil amendments on all four beds.
 We don't know how much additional help will be needed; we will send out an update as the date approaches.
- April 17th The wall structure to be done during this week by the Maintenance Specialty Contractor.
- April 26th / 27th New plants will be installed, assuming all the plants are available. We would like anyone who has a pickup to help us transport the plants. Master Gardeners will play a major role. As the time gets closer, we will determine the amount of help needed.
- May 4th Irrigation to be done. Anyone with Drip Irrigation Hole Punch experience would be helpful. All are welcome and we will determine the necessary number closer to the actual date. Plus, we want to run the system prior to mulch being laid down so we don't have any surprises.
- May 8th / 9th Install mulch. We need to move mulch from Scott's house to entrances, so those with pickups will be needed again. We could use about 10 people to help on these days.
