## Here's the story behind Black History Month — and why it's celebrated in February

Every February, the U.S. honors the contributions and sacrifices of African Americans who have helped shape the nation. Black History Month celebrates the rich cultural heritage, triumphs and adversities that are an indelible part of our country's history.



This year's theme, Black Health and Wellness, pays homage to medical scholars and health care providers. The theme is especially timely as we enter the third year of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has disproportionately affected minority communities and placed unique burdens on Black health care professionals.

time to promote and educate people about Black history and culture, according to W. Marvin Dulaney. He is a historian and the president of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH). Woodson envisioned a weeklong celebration to encourage the coordinated teaching of Black history in public schools. He designated the second week of February as Negro History Week and galvanized fellow historians through the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, which he founded in 1915. (ASNLH later became ASALH.) The idea wasn't to place limitations but really to focus and broaden the nation's consciousness. Carter G. Woodson (1875-1950) was an American historian, a scholar and the founder of the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. Woodson was instrumental in launching Negro History Week in 1926.

"Woodson's goal from the very beginning was to make the celebration of Black history in the field


of history a 'serious area of study,' " said Albert Broussard, a professor of Afro-American history at Texas A&M University. The idea eventually grew in acceptance, and by the late 1960s, Negro History Week had evolved into what is now known as Black History Month.

Protests around racial injustice, inequality and anti-imperialism that were occurring in many parts of the U.S. were pivotal to the change. Colleges and universities also began to hold commemorations, with Kent State University being one of the first, according to Kaplan. Fifty years after the first celebrations, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black History Month during the country's 1976 bicentennial. Ford called upon Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history," History.com reports.

# Why do we celebrate Black History Month in February?

February was chosen primarily because the second week of the month coincides with the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. Lincoln was influential in the emancipation of slaves, and Douglass, a former slave, was a prominent leader in the abolitionist movement, which fought to end slavery. Lincoln and Douglass were each born in the second week of February, so it was traditionally a time when African Americans would hold celebrations in honor of emancipation, Kaplan said. (Douglass' exact date of birth wasn't recorded, but he came to celebrate it on Feb. 14.)

Thus, Woodson created Negro History Week around the two birthdays as a way of "commemorating the black past," according to ASALH. Forty years after Ford formally recognized Black History Month, it was Barack Obama, the nation's first Black president, who delivered a message of his own from the White House, a place built by slaves.

"Black History Month shouldn't be treated as though it is somehow separate from our collective American history or somehow just boiled down to a compilation of greatest hits from the March on Washington or from some of our sports heroes," Obama said. "It's about the lived, shared experience of all African Americans, high and low, famous and obscure, and how those experiences have shaped and challenged and ultimately strengthened America," he continued.


(Canada and the U.K. also commemorate Black History Month in February, and Ireland celebrates it in October.)

**There's a new theme every year** ASALH designates a new theme for Black History Month each year, in keeping with the practice Woodson established for Negro History Week. This year's Black Health and Wellness theme is particularly appropriate, Dulaney said, as the U.S. continues to fight the coronavirus pandemic. "As [Black people], we have terrible health outcomes, and even the coronavirus has been affecting us disproportionately in terms of those of us who are catching it," Dulaney said.

"There's never been a time where Black people and others should not celebrate Black history," Broussard said. "Given the current racial climate, the racial reckoning that began in wake of George Floyd's murder ... this is an opportunity to learn."

A former military ammo barge was purchased to house the clubhouse and EBC's original location was in Owl Harbor. The clubhouse was located for a time at Bruno's Island and then San Joaquin Harbor. Ebony moved the clubhouse to its present location at the Stockton Marina in 2014.

From its very beginning, EBC has been a community conscious club with its scholarships and youth programs. Ebony awarded its first scholarship in 1987 and in 2016 established the Ebony Youth Foundation. To date EBC

has given over 30 scholarships. Ebony has three youth programs each year and feeds the disadvantaged. Ebony Boat Club and its members are known and respected throughout the Northern California yachting community. We hold a well-earned five star status with the Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association.

I invite you to take a look at our Facebook page to view over 600 photos of Ebony Boat Club history.


We are now a diverse club and welcome all. One day it will not matter that we are a predominately African American club but we will always remember our beginnings and take pride in who we are!

## A Message From: THE PORT/FLEET CAPTAIN

Greetings fellow boaters.

In the ever ending challenge to stay safe on the Delta waters ways I recentely came accross an article describing tides that I have been asked to share with our members.

**What is tide?** It's water's vertical movement. Tidal current flows in and out, and tides rise and fall.

• If you've ever read Eldridge or a similar tide book, you know that tidal current can still be moving in, even though the tide has started to fall.

• The rise and fall of tides are caused primarily by the moon. Though much smaller, the moon exerts 2.25 times the amount of gravitational pull on the oceans as does the sun. This is due to it being so much closer to Earth.

• When tides fall, the water goes from the poles to the equator. The spinning Earth creates centrifugal force that causes the water at the poles to be shallower and creates a bulge of water at the equator. Thus, there's always a place for the water to go.

• Neap tides, like the word "neap" itself, which means near even as possible, show little difference in height between high and low tide. Neap tides occur when the moon and sun are at right angles to the Earth. This results in quarter moon.

• **Spring tides** are higher and lower than normal. Spring tides occur when the sun and moon are aligned with the

Earth. This full alignment occurs during periods of full moon and new moon. At other times – with one exception – the gravitational pulls of moon and sun work against each other. The alignment multiplies the gravitational pull, creating higher highs and lower lows. The stars, on the other hand, exert only a minimal gravitational pull on the Earth.

• During a solar eclipse, spring tides will occur. The moon blocks the sun's light during an eclipse, but its gravity pulls just the same.

• While tidal movement is caused by the sun and moon, the tidal day is actually 24 hours and 50 minutes long. This is because it takes a while to get all that water moving. Yes, there's friction between earth and sea.

• A region experiencing semidiurnal tides has two high tides and two low tides per day. The most common type of tides is semidiurnal.

• **Diurnal tides,** in which there is but one high and one low per day, occurs only in select locations such as the Java Sea, the Tonkin Gulf and the Gulf of Mexico.

• **Mixed tides** are semidiurnal tides in which there are great differences between the height of each of the two daily highs and each of the two daily lows.

• The Rule of Twelfths is a rule of thumb allowing you to estimate the height of tide and the relative current flow for any area experiencing diurnal tides. It is expressed as a fraction of total volume per hour. All you need to know is the time of high or low tide. Starting from there, the tide will move in or out over the next six hours as follows: 1/12, 2/12, 3/12, 3/12, 2/12, 1/12.

• Using the Rule of Twelfths can be important while cruising. For example, you can estimate when the most water will be flowing through an inlet — generally during the middle of a tide — which can cause the roughest conditions. Or in shoal areas, you can estimate how much water to expect beneath your keel at a given time.



Before you head out it is recommended that you prepare a trip plan. Your trip plan should be shared with a responsible person or persons and updated as the trip progresses, and plans change to avoid unnecessary search and rescue emergency calls. An up-to-date Trip Plan can aid in search and rescue efforts if they are needed.

## Filing a Trip Plan

# The following information should be included in the Trip Plan:

- The name and number of the pleasure craft
- Type of vessel
- Name, address, and telephone number of the owner
- Number of people on board
- Size, type, and color of pleasure craft
- Type of engine
- Distinguishing features of the pleasure craft

- Type of radiotelephone, and channel monitored
- Safety equipment carried including flares, lifejackets, and life rafts
- Description of the trip, time of departure, estimated time of return, the proposed route
- Instructions in case of emergency

### Consider a Pre-Departure Checklist Loading The Boat

You mustn't overload your boat. The Capacity Plate will tell you the recommended gross load capacity or the equivalent number of adults that can be safely carried on your vessel. Make sure that people and gear are positioned so that the weight is evenly distributed throughout the boat. It is important to keep the load as low as possible to help stabilize the craft. To avoid having gear moving about the boat, stow it in lockers, or lash it down.

## **Instructions To Your Guests**

- Your guests should embark and disembark by stepping low to the center of the boat, holding onto the sides of the boat. Tell them not to jump from the dock to the boat and not to step on the gunwales.
- Make sure they know where the lifejackets are located and how to put them on, Emphasize the importance of wearing lifejackets at all times.
- Tell your guests where the Emergency Kit is located.
- If they will be moving about in the boat, make sure they know to keep themselves low, on the centerline, and to hold onto something

as they move about. Remind them that falls are the number one cause of injuries on board boats

- Advise your guests to keep their arms and legs inside the boat...flying debris and water can break arms and legs...when approaching and leaving a dock arms and legs are no match for the power of the moving vessel.
- Remind your guests that drinking alcohol is prohibited onboard a vessel that is underway...alcohol is only permitted on a boat fitted as a residence with sleeping facilities, a galley and a head. Make your guest aware that the motion of the pleasure craft, sunlight, waves, wind, sound, and/or alcohol will affect the abilities, balance, reflexes, eyesight, hearing, and judgment of both you, as the operator, and them, as guests
- Explain to your guests that they may have a role in an emergency situation and that you will require their co-operation if that occurs
- Explain to the guests what would happen if you, as the operator, become unable to bring the boat back to the dock and who will operate the boat.
- Advise your guests not to smoke during engine start-up, fueling, or around hazardous materials like fuel-burning appliances

## Is Your Boat's Long Winter Nap Going Well?

## BoatUS: Follow these 5 midwinter checkup tips for boat owners

SPRINGFIELD, VA., Jan. 24, 2022 – Storms have hammered the U.S., and many recreational boats are sleeping away the winter under a layer of ice and snow. If you store your boat outside and haven't checked up on her lately, Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS) has five tips for a midwinter checkup that could help prevent an insurance claim, help keep you safe, and also make spring commissioning easier.

- If your boat is stored in the water over the winter, never visit alone. Also, let the yard know you're there. If the boat is stored on land, ensure the ladder (if required to board) is on a solid footing clear of ice, and have a friend hold it while you're ascending/descending. Securely tie it off at the top.
- When aboard, remember the mantra "one hand for yourself" – keeping one hand securely attached to the boat to steady yourself and prevent a fall. Decks may be extremely slippery. Bring a soft broom to help you remove snow.
- Tarps and covers put on months ago have had a chance to sag or loosen, potentially allowing moisture aboard. Keeping a tight lid is critical to a

smooth spring commissioning and preventing water damage. In a worstcase scenario, mama raccoon can sneak under a loose cover and may be dining on your upholstery. Most insurance policies do not cover vermin damage. For those who DIY cover their boats, ice and snow need to shed easily and not add tremendous weight that can damage stanchions, windscreens or trailers.

- 4. Go under the winter cover and check enclosed spaces. Replace desiccants with fresh material. Keep lockers and compartments open to reduce mold. Ensure any scuppers and drains remain clear – if your tarp or cover does get damaged by storms, water needs a way out. Using an electric heater in winter can present a significant fire hazard.
- 5. If you notice that any jackstands have settled, call the yard or marina. Don't attempt to move or adjust them yourself. Also ensure winter cover lines are not tied off to the jackstands as they could be pulled out from under the boat during high winds.

## Windstar Cruises' Belinda Bennett: 'I refused to be broken'

The cruise industry's first female black captain says she had to work twice as hard as the men to get where she is. Belinda Bennett has held a rather high distinction in the cruise industry for five years so far. In March 2016, the Saint Helena native became the



first black female captain of a cruise-ship by taking the helm of Windstar Cruises' 148-berth Wind Star (built 1986), a four-masted sailing yacht that travels the Mediterranean Sea. Bennett, 44, began her maritime career at 17 years old when she became a deck cadet on the 6,767-gt passenger and cargo-ship RMS St Helena (built 1989).

She rose to the position of second officer on the vessel and subsequently held that rank on the SS Dalphine — a private charter yacht near Monaco — and ferries owned by Isle of Man Steam Packet Co.

She earned a masters unlimited certificate and joined Windstar Cruises as a second officer in 2005, before rising through the ranks to become captain of the Wind Star five years ago.

# "Once I landed in the cruise industry, it definitely became a goal," she told TradeWinds.

"Open communication is key in this job. If you can talk to your team and get them to talk to you, life is a lot easier."

Bennett said what has not been easy is finding an employer that would help her fulfill her dream of becoming a captain.

"I actually tried to stay in the yachting industry but, after gaining my masters unlimited certificate, I came to find out I was a little 'overqualified' at that time and an apparent threat to the very maledominated yachting industry back then," she said.

"So I ended up at Windstar, where I have happily been for the last 15-plus years."She has not forgotten the days when she had to work harder than white male cadets to prove her worth as a sailor, but she holds no grudges.

"I had a chief officer, unfortunately, who made me work later than the sailors, so they would knock off for the day, and I would be left outside continuing to work until it got dark," she said. "It really was a make-or-break-you time and, me being me, I refused to be broken." She said she has certainly run into both racism and sexism over the years as a black female in a white, male-dominated field, but she somehow finds a bright side to this.

Her hard work and determination have not gone completely unnoticed. In 2018, Bennett was awarded the Merchant Navy Medal for Meritorious Service. HRH Princess Anne presented her with the honour under the auspices of the UK Department for Transport and the nation's Maritime and Coastguard Agency.

The award, given to 20 recipients every year since 2016, recognizes contributions that members of the Merchant Navy make to maritime safety, seafarer welfare, training and the blue economy.

"They have gone above and beyond their duty for the benefit of others," then UK maritime minister Nusrat Ghani said when Bennett received the award in 2018.

"Belinda's trailblazing is [an example] of the outstanding service provided by our mariners."

Bennett said times are indeed changing for the better in maritime when it comes to diversity, but further strides must be taken.

"The fact that the industry is still very maledominated, it shouldn't deter anyone coming to sea," she said. "And women are moving up in the ranks more than ever before."

#### Shipping's women leaders hail new generation

Women still only make up 2% of worldwide seafarers, but 94% of those are working in the cruise industry, according to the International Maritime Organization.

"Being a woman, you have to work extra hard to prove yourself — even more than a man," Bennett said. "Some men might not like that, but that's the way it is."

Despite this harsh, unfair reality in maritime, she gives these words of advice to women and girls who want a rewarding career on the sea.



"Work hard, be strong and don't let anything deter you," she said. "I've done it. You can do it, too."<u>(Copyright)</u>

1. Combine all the ingredients except whipped cream. Mix well

2. Pour into greased and floured 9x13 inch cake pan

Add beans and spinach; simmer just until carrots are soft and meat reaches an internal temperature of 160 F. Season, if desired. Remove bay leaf. To serve, ladle soup into bowls, sprinkle with cheese. Makes 6 to 8 servings.



### You Can Protect Our Waterways by Becoming a Dockwalker

#### Who are DOCKWALKERS?

Dockwalkers are partners who inspire and educate boaters and other recreators to be safe and environmentally sound while boating in California. These partners distribute boater kits with educational materials while visiting marinas, boat launch ramps, boat shows and events. *If you are already a trained Dockwalker and were trained more than 3 years ago, please join us next year for a refresher class. Anyone from 16- 100 years young can become a Dockwalker.* 

#### How Do Dockwalkers Help?

The efforts of Dockwalkers increase boater awareness about clean and safe boating, thus improving the recreation experience in California while helping to preserve its precious wildlife habitat and water quality. There are over 1,000 Dockwalkers statewide who have distributed more than 100,000 boater kits since 2000.

#### How Do I Become a DOCKWALKER?

People interested in becoming Dockwalkers are required to attend a FREE 2.5-hour training class. During the class participants learn about potential sources of boat pollution and their impact, environmental regulations for boaters, and clean boating practices that prevent pollution from boating. In addition, the training provides information on how to conduct Dockwalking and an overview of the educational materials Dockwalkers will distribute including the boater kits. Age range is 15 years and up. The program can document community service hours. Contact the California State Parks and the California Coastal Commission's Boating Clean and Green Program at (415) 904-6905; <u>vmatuk@coastal.ca.gov</u> or visit <u>www.BoatingCleanandGreen.com</u> to register for a class.

#### What Is a Boater Kit?

The <u>boater kit</u> is an educational tool for boaters. Items include: a pocketbook of tide tables, Division of Boating and Waterways pamphlets (*ABC's of the California Boating Law*), oil absorbent pillow with reusable zip tie and instructions, and more. Depending on your region, we may also provide the Delta Clean Boating map and/or the San Francisco Bay Area Clean Boating Map and the new edition of the Southern California Boater's Guide. Boaters can receive a boater kit after completing a brief boater questionnaire/pledge. This questionnaire will help to identify gaps in environmental services and better target future boater education efforts.

#### How Can I Order the Boater Kits?

After the class we will be mailing you some boater kits. If you are a very active Dockwalker and need more boater kits, please contact the Division of Boating and Waterways and the California Coastal Commission's Boating Clean and Green Program at (415) 904-6905 or <u>vmatuk@coastal.ca.gov</u>.

#### What is a Recreational Boater Questionnaire/Pledge?

All boaters who receive a boater kit must complete a brief and anonymous <u>Recreational Boater Questionnaire/Pledge</u>. The information is used to improve the Program, better understand boater behavior and identify gaps in terms of safe and clean boating education and services.

#### What is the Dockwalker Contest?

In recognition of the good work and dedication of our clean boating Dockwalkers, the top Dockwalkers who return the most number of completed boaters questionnaire will be honored with great awards donated to our partners and will join the ranks in the Dockwalker Hall of Fame. Dockwalkers will be asked to collect their boater questionnaires and return them after finishing their Dockwalking activities.

#### How Marina/Yacht Clubs Benefit from Becoming Dockwalkers?

Marina/Yacht operators and staff believe that education is critical to successfully operating a clean boating facility and minimizing water quality impacts. Becoming a Dockwalker or having a staff person or yacht club members trained as Dockwalkers will provide you with the educational materials and tools to work with your tenants and visitors as partners in the clean marina/yacht club, clean water effort. This program provides marinas with points towards the clean marina designation. Participation in the DOCKWALKER PROGRAM counts towards the nomination of the Club of the Year under the community service category.




