

It's training time again. This months' tips are on the maintenance of your boat

and trailer. I hope this information is helpful and that all boat owners are following both maintenance upkeep and safety factors of boating at all times.

Boat And Trailer Maintenance Checklist

Take care of the boat, trailer, and engine and the chances of a problem occurring on the water or the road will be minimized. Here's what you need to know.



Whether you do it yourself or leave it to the pros, routine maintenance is essential to keep your rig in tip-top shape

So you're a new boat owner. Your pristine centerconsole sits proudly in your driveway, the outboard shining brightly in the sun, and even the trailer is sleek and polished. How can you keep it at least close to looking and performing as it does now? Maintenance is the key.

But if you're not mechanically inclined, how can you properly care for your new rig? If you're all thumbs, budget in some bucks for dealer maintenance. In this case, it's probably best for both you and your boat if you leave the mechanical details to the pros. You can, however, perform all the tasks that don't require technical expertise. Such tasks as keeping fittings and moving parts lubricated, cleaning and waxing the finish, checking the drive lubricant and engine oil, making sure that fishing line isn't wrapped around the prop shaft — these are all examples of simple skills a responsible boater should learn, especially to protect his or her investment. While boats have never been cheap, they seem to be more expensive than ever when compared to the average paycheck, so it's smart ownership to make sure that all is up to snuff.

To help you out, we've created a simple Timeline and Maintenance Chart, one that works for DIYers and tech-savvy boaters alike. Refer to the chart to check maintenance items before every outing and at every 20, 50, and 100 hours of use. Seasonal boaters should consult the chart before every layup. With our chart as your guide, your rig will stay like new for longer and command top price at resale or trade-in time, particularly if you keep records of what you've done and when. The chart is the suggested schedule, although some boats may require more frequent checks. If in doubt always follow the manufacturer's recommendations for your particular boat, engine, and trailer

COMMUNICATING ON THE WATER and the VHF Marine Radio

Communication on the water can be as simple as finding the local fishing hole, to responding to a life and death situation where time is of the essence.

Ensuring others understand what you are attempting to communicate is of the utmost importantance.

Some do's and don'ts on the water.

- Never leave shore without a working VHF Radio.
- Make sure you are aware of the working channels in your area. Channel 16 is for the Coast Guard and emergency use only and *not for boater conversation*.
- When initating a call to another boat, **repeat the name of the boat you're calling three times** then broadcast your vessel name and finish with"over".
- Respond to another boat who has called you, by stating their name, then your name and the phrase "over".
- When you are finished with the conversation, state your vessel name and the phrase "out."
- "OVER" and "OUT" are never used at the same time, since their meanings are mutually exclusive.
- Mayday calls are for emergency situations requiring immediate assistance. The proper etiquette here is to not abuse the use of a mayday call. Use it as a last resort only! If you hear a mayday call and are close enough to respond, you must do so!



12 Household Items That Need Extra Attention After You've Been Sick

Whether it's the flu, a stomach virus, or strep throat (a personal nemesis of mine), chances are you've encountered some sort of illness in your home this cold and flu season.

If you're not careful to scour even the most unassuming corners and crevices of your home with disinfectants, you might be at war with those germs all over again (not to mention, infect other folks in the meantime). Germs can live on surfaces for up to 24 hours, which is a pretty large window to encounter them when you're living in close quarters with others. Be on the safe side and regularly clean these 12 items to avoid a sickly holiday season. More than likely, your kitchen was probably due for a deep clean anyway. And remember— disinfectant wipes used incorrectly can just as easily turn into germ bombs.

1. Countertop

Your gorgeous, cook-friendly countertop can be a breeding ground for infectious germs, and if it's granite or patterned, you might struggle to detect even visible messes like crumbs and spills. You don't even want to know how much invisible gunk is plastered on there too. To clean, use a store-bought disinfectant spray or mix up a cleaning solution with ½ cup of bleach per gallon of cold water (p.s. never mix anything with bleach besides water!). Let this solution sit on the surface for five minutes after spraying, then wipe with a wet cloth or let air dry. And no, bleach won't ruin your granite countertops.

2. Silverware

All dishes, but especially those that come in direct contact with your mouth, should be sanitized in a dishwasher so they can reach bacteria-killing

temps. If you don't have one, wash your utensils with soap and hot water (at least 110° F), then soak in a chlorine bleach bath (made with one part bleach to 10 parts warm water), rinse, and allow to air-dry.

3. Dish Towels

There's no telling how many times (and by how many people) those cute, handy dish rags are touched every day. Try to quit your habit of drying your hands on conveniently-located dish towels—unless they're replaced daily—and reach for paper towels instead. When you do wash dish towels, change the washer setting to hot to make sure all germs are killed off.

4. Knobs/Handles

Pantry, oven, fridge, and dishwasher handles should all be considered suspect when making a post-illness clean sweep. Make sure to disinfect them (using the bleach solution noted above!) all around the house, not just in common areas.

5. Sponge

Bacteria love to multiply in environments that are moist and warm—i.e. the state of your kitchen sponge 90% of the time. Microwave your sponges for a minute to kill germs, or buy a new pack altogether. Researchers from a 2017 study suggest replacing your sponges weekly regardless.

6. Faucet Handles

Sinks should be a safe zone because they're where you wash your hands, right? Unfortunately, the germy hand you turn on the faucet with isn't clean just yet. And even if your hands are clean when you turn off the nozzle, the damage is already done. Your sink handles—and basin—should be sanitized with a bleach solution at least once a week, according to an expert.

7. TV Remote

The same spots that dust and grime can build up between your remote controls' buttons, germs are likely creeping. Give it a wipe down after it's fought over by your kids, spouse, or visiting relatives.

7 Foods That Can Cause Food Poisoning

Food-borne illnesses from disease-causing germs pose greater danger as you age.

En español | Catching an intestinal illness from something you eat is unpleasant at any age, but the stakes grow higher the older you get, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) warns. "Older adults in general are more likely to have severe illness [from food poisoning] that could land them in the hospital," says Patricia Griffin, M.D., chief of the CDC's Enteric Diseases Epidemiology branch, which tracks foodborne illnesses. Nearly half of people 65 and older with a confirmed foodborne illness caused by salmonella, campylobacter, listeria or E. coli end up hospitalized, according to the CDC. As you age, your immune system slows down, curbing its ability to fight off germs. You're also more likely to develop a chronic health condition, such as diabetes or heart disease, when you're older. Both factors increase the risk of getting food poisoning and developing a serious illness from it. Even otherwise healthy older adults who take stomach-acid reducers may be creating a dangerous situation for themselves, Griffin adds, because stomach acid helps kill harmful germs found in foods.

"Many older adults are quite healthy and don't think of themselves as having increased risk," she says. "But they should recognize that as we all age, our immune system becomes a little more sluggish, and we need to take more precautions to prevent ourselves from getting sick." A top precaution from the CDC is to cook food until it reaches its safe internal temperature, to kill any harmful bacteria, viruses or parasites that may be present. Other safety measures include washing your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds before preparing food, rinsing fresh produce under running water before eating it and avoiding cross-contamination in the kitchen — in particular, raw meat, poultry, seafood and eggs — when preparing meals.

Here are seven types of foods that the CDC warns can cause intestinal illness, along with the most common disease-causing germs associated with each and safety tips to avoid them.

1. Chicken, beef, pork and turkey

Undercooking and cross-contamination are the two biggest risks posed by meats. Wash your hands; keep raw meat away from other ingredients; and cook chicken, beef, pork and turkey to safe temperatures. The CDC recommends using a cooking thermometer, though Griffin acknowledges that not everyone has one or uses it regularly.

"You have to rely often on getting something steaming hot that looks to you well cooked," she says. "A thermometer is best. But cooking your meat products really well is very important."

Common foodborne germs: Campylobacter, Clostridium perfringens, E. coli, salmonella, Yersinia

Safety tips: Ignore recipes that advise rinsing raw meats with water. The practice doesn't make your food any safer, and splashed water can spread germs from the raw meat to other food, utensils and surfaces. Always make sure your meat is sufficiently cooked. Older adults who prefer the taste of rare beef or pork are taking a risk, Griffin says. Leftovers should be refrigerated at 40 degrees or colder within two hours of preparation. Large cuts of meat should be portioned into small quantities to cool fast enough and prevent bacteria from growing.

2. Fruits and vegetables

Produce can pick up germs anywhere along the way, from the farm where it was grown to the store where


Janet Noyd Scholarship Committee Chair



PROMOTING CLEAN BOATING THROUGH EDUCATION

One of the most effective methods for providing information to boaters is word of mouth. In 1999, Save Our Shores (SOS) started the Dockwalker program to provide one-on-one outreach in local harbors to help boaters appropriately discard of used oil, share best clean boating practices, and waste products. In 2000, the Boating Clean and Green Program borrowed the Dockwalkers name and general concept, with permission from SOS, and developed a statewide Dockwalker program.

The California Dockwalker program is led by California Coastal Commission and the California Division of Boating and Waterways' Boating Clean and Green Program and is implemented in partnership with The Bay Foundation. Many organizations have made this program successful including: Save Our Shores, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, and the US Power Squadrons. Other partners include: Lake Berryessa Partnership, San Mateo County, Pacific Inter Yacht Club Association, the City of Newport Beach, Humboldt BayKeeper, the Clean Marinas California Program, West Marine, among others.

BAKED EGGS

I decided to prepare a special breakfast for Sunday after the Jazz and Wine Festival event. Here's the list of items served.

Baked Eggs Fried Apples Crisp Bacon Hot Biscuits Buttery Grits Sausage and Gravy

INGREDIENTS

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coat each cup in cupcake pan with butter. Place 1 teaspoon of milk in each cup. Add 1/2 pat of butter to each cup. Add an egg to each cup and sprinkle with salt and pepper (to taste). Bake for 15-30 minutes. Remove with a spoon and keep warm until served. If you like your yolk soft cook, remove egg after 15 min, if you like your eggs hard cook longer. Test the yolk with a toothpick, Enjoy!

3-Ingredient Baked Pork Chops

Exciting news—you're just three ingredients away from a magnificently meaty main dish! This crispy, oven-baked pork chop recipe works just as well for boneless, center-cut pork chops, simply check them after 10-15 minutes and be sure not to let them overcook.

Ingredients

2 large eggs

4 (6- to 8-oz.) bone-in center-cut pork chops Salt and pepper (optional)

1 cup Italian-seasoned breadcrumbs

Directions

Step 1 Preheat oven to 400°F. Scramble eggs in a shallow dish. Sprinkle pork chops with salt and pepper, if desired. Dip pork chops in eggs, and allow excess to drip off. Coat pork chops in breadcrumbs.

Step 2 Place pork chops on a baking rack lightly coated with cooking spray, set rack in a rimmed baking sheet. Bake in preheated oven until a thermometer inserted in thickest portion registers 150°F, 20 to 25 minutes. Let rest 5 minutes before serving.

"She [Hannah] wept and did not eat ... She made a vow and said, 'O Lord of hosts ... if You will ... give Your maidservant a male child, then I will give him to the Lord all the days of his life." – 1 Samuel 1:7, 11 NKJV






