

In the meantime Pam and I will be cruising and fishing the beautiful Mokelumne River. While there, Pam has been catching and releasing on average a dozen striped bass per day





RBOC: COVID-19:

Governor Orders New Statewide Restrictions

Hello Californians,

Governor Newsom this afternoon has announced that, effective immediately, some indoor business operations must close statewide, plus additional business operations in those counties that are on the California Department of Public Health's monitoring list for three consecutive days.

From the Department of Public Health:

Effective July 13, 2020, ALL counties must close indoor operations in these sectors:

Dine-in restaurants

Wineries and tasting rooms

Movie theaters

Family entertainment centers (for example: bowling alleys, miniature golf, batting cages and arcades) Zoos and museums

Card-rooms

Additionally, bars, brewpubs, breweries, and pubs must close all operations both indoor and outdoor statewide. Counties that have remained on the County Monitoring List for 3 consecutive days will be required to shut down the following industries unless they can be modified to operate outside or by pick-up.

Fitness centers

Worship services

Protests

for non-essential sectors

Personal care services, like nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors

Hair salons and barbershops Malls



MASHED POTOTO STUFFED MEATLOAF

Make your favorite meatloaf mixture and set it aside. When boiling the potatoes add whole garlic cloves about ½ cup. Drain and mash the potatoes and garlic with butter, salt, pepper. You can use more or less garlic depending on your taste. Make enough to have some left to serve as the side. Line your baking dish with foil

Place half of the meat mixture in the dish at least 1 inch thick. Make a little trough in the meat layer but not to the bottom of the layer. Add the mashed potatoes covering the entire bottom layer. Add the remaining meat layer sealing in the potatoes completely. It is important for the potatoes to be completely sealed inside for a pretty presentation.

Fold the foil loosely and bake at 350 until the meat is done. How long depends on how big the meatloaf is. Let it rest for about 15 before serving. Serve with the extra potatoes and veggies. It taste even better the next day. ENJOY!


