This past Monday, March 16, 2020 Governor Gavin Newsome stated that he wants all bars, brewpubs and nightclubs closed and restaurants to limit their customers to no more than 50 patrons at a time. He further suggested that persons over the age of 65 self quarantine.

Later that day six Bay Area counties including Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Solano are now ordering EVERYONE to self quarantine and not leave home for non-essential reasons. This excludes public safety officers and medical personnel.

That's my overview of what's been happening around the club.



March is International Women's Month. I would like to share some news about some outstanding Commercial Ship Captains who are women.

There was a time when women were considered as bad luck on ships, a distraction to the crew and an anger to the seas. Until the 1970's many maritime academies did not admit women and there were no cruise ship captains until the first woman appointed captain of a cruise ship, Captain Karin Stahre-Janson of Sweden, who in 2007 took command of Royal Caribbean's Monarch of the Seas.

In 2015 Captain Kate McCue is the first American woman to captain a cruise ship. Kate was born in San Francisco, California and attended California State University Maritime Academy, Vallejo, California.

Captain Belinda Bennett is the world's first Black woman to become a cruise ship captain. Capt. Bennett grew up on the small of Island St. Helena located in the South Atlantic Ocean between South Africa and South America. The Island was small, and Belinda wanted to see the world. At age 17 she took a job on the RMS St. Helena. But it wasn't easy for her as a female cadet. She was made to work harder and later than the other cadets. She prevailed and took a job on a private yacht off the coast of Monaco. After that she worked on Steam Packet ferries, and eventually she went back to school

for her master's degree. Upon obtaining her master's she tried to go back to the private yachts, which did not pan out for her and was told by an agent in Antibes that she had three things going against her:

- 1) She had a higher education than most captains at the time
- 2) She was a woman
- 3) She was black

She took a hard look at her options and joined Windstar Cruises in 2005. She climbed the ranks from second officer to chief officer and then in January 2016 she made the rank of Captain of the MSY Windstar.

All three of these women have at least one thing in common, they were the first! The first Woman Captain, the first American Woman Captain and the first Black Woman Captain. It's not easy being the first.

Thanks to all of the leaders that paid the price so that others may follow in their footsteps.

To all of the hard working, women of the world, Happy International Women's Month.



- All applicants must COMPLETE and submit a typed (all questions answered and signed) Ebony Youth Foundation (EYF) scholarship application and include the following items in your packet:
- 1. Letter of acceptance from a qualifying post-secondary institution (accredited college or university).
- 2. At least two (2) letters of recommendation describing the applicant's personality, integrity and leadership potential.
 - 1 must be from an Ebony Boat Club (EBC) member.
 - 1 school official or community leader.
- Applicants must submit an <u>official</u> transcript in a sealed envelope.
- 4. A photograph suitable for publication is required. If you are selected as a recipient of an Ebony Youth Foundation Scholarship Award your picture will be used in the Inaugural Ball Program and the Ebony Boat Club's Beacon Newsletter and other publications to promote the Ebony Youth Foundation Scholarship Program.

Completed application packet must be POSTMARKED BY JUNE 1, 2020

All <u>finalists</u> must participate in an oral interview with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
