Households with one person age 65 or older must provide proof of permanent income, such as Social Security benefits and self-declare the household income and total housing expenses. Households whose housing expenses exceed 30% of the household income may qualify. All participants are further assessed for additional case management support, to assist them in navigating resources and barriers to services.
