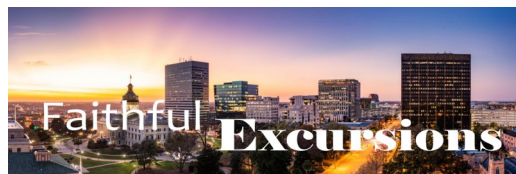

Council Highlights:

- Lillian Irene Minor, Blakely Foster Goings, Amelia Elizabeth Hilton, and Kate Latham met with Council and were unanimously approved after a brief questioning by Council.
- Minutes from March and April were unanimously approved.
- Council voted unanimously to approve sending 25% of the Total Easter Offering, \$26,254.00, to be split 1/3 each to Palmetto Place, Sister Care and Midlands Orphan Relief.

Pastoral Ponderings

“...For the Lord does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart.” 1 Samuel 16:7b

A few years ago, I passed by my wife, Irina, in the hallway. She was leading her Sunday School class of four- and five-year-old kids down to the church’s kitchen to teach them a lesson using the stove. In the years since, that same lesson has been used at confirmation camp and continues to be the favorite lesson that we do all week. The lesson, in short, was this... are you a potato, an egg, or a coffee bean? This lesson has been derived from the book, “The Coffee Bean” by Jon Gordon.

Are you a potato, an egg, or a coffee bean? We live in a world that stress and pressure seem to be a constant state of existence for most of us. Author Jon Gordon likens this stress and pressure to a boiling pot of water on the stove. As the same water boils, what goes into that water has different reactions to the same heat and stress, causing three very different outcomes. As a potato is being boiled, it softens, turning to mush, and falls apart under the extreme heat. In the same boiling water, an egg that starts fragile becomes hardened. Meanwhile, amid the same boiling water, a coffee bean is added, yet the heat doesn’t affect the bean. The bean starts to affect the water, transforming it from a useless pot of hot water to a delicious cup of coffee.

The takeaway is simple. We live in a world full of sin and death, grief and pain, bad news and exhausted lives. We find ourselves with the boiling water every day. That hot water has the potential to soften us, frighten us, even burn us - turning us into mush. We cannot let it. God has made you strong and courageous, and given you the armor of the Gospel to defend you from sin, death, and the devil. We are called to stand tall, speak out, and act courageously in this life. You are not mush, but a beloved child of God.

The boiling water has the potential to harden us like the egg. We can find ourselves hardened and calloused by the difficult experiences we have throughout this life. However, when hardened too much, we tend to block out the love and grace God gives us through our friends and family. Therefore, we miss the life God intended for us to live. While being too soft can lead us to being abused in the life, being too hard keeps us away from the experiences God desires for us. You are a child of God, and the invitation to the cross is a path of vulnerability that leads to salvation.

Yet, if we are like the coffee bean, when the boiling water we find ourselves in is raging at its peak, we allow what God first planted inside us to come out. As we let the love and grace of God seep out from us, we transform the very water we dwell in, flooding it with Christ’s presence, forgiveness, and love for us and those around us. Since we are children of God, we are called to shine Christ’s light in the midst of the darkness, and to shine it on all who have sat in darkness for too long. Our hands, our feet, and our hearts have joined to that of Jesus. So that when we love, we love with His heart and we are all transformed.

Be the coffee bean for the sake of the world God loves so much. Make yourself available for God to use you and your life to transform the world around you. Don’t let the evil in this world ruin you; turn you too soft or too hard. Let God’s love perk in your life, so that others may “Taste and see that the Lord is good!” Amen.

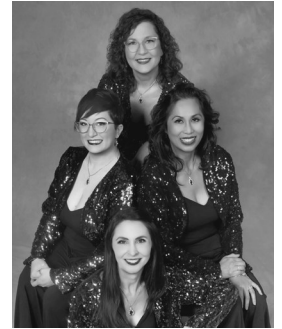

Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

We meet on Monday and Thursday at 5:30 in room 121, walking at 4:30. All ability levels are welcome! Variations of exercises are offered! Join our group. If you have questions, please ask Tammy O'Quinn, Brennen Hutto or Carol Busbee.

You may have heard the fitness words mobility and flexibility. Some people use these words interchangeably, but they really mean different things; however these terms are related. Mobility deals with the movement of the joints while flexibility deals with the stretching of muscles, ligaments and tendons. Both are very important for healthy movement. Good mobility to keep your joints moving also requires good flexibility of the soft tissues of the muscles, ligaments and tendons. It is possible to be flexible but lack mobility.

It is important to continue to work on strength exercises. This month's article is going to focus on exercises for good mobility - the movement of the joints. Joint exercises focus on stability and support the body. Quoted by Scott Busbee, DPT, "motion is lotion". Arthritis makes joints stiff and hurt but daily motion helps the body to lubricate the joints. Gentle movements warm the joints and low impact exercise like walking, cycling and swimming can help to lubricate the joints.

The steps to good mobility are simple, daily gentle warm-ups and strength training. Know your limits and don't push your joints beyond your comfort zone. Always keep good posture which keeps your joints in line.

Here are a few exercises to improve mobility. Perform the following exercises with slow and controlled movements. These are good warm-ups too!

Neck Rotations - Stand or sit. Start with your chin to your chest. Slowly roll one ear toward your shoulder then back to your chest. Repeat on the other side. Do 3 or more sets. Whatever feels comfortable.

Arm Circles - Stand with feet under your shoulders. Hold your arms straight out to the side and rotate your arms in small circles forward then backwards. Try to make circles in each direction for about 30 seconds.

Cat and Cow - Start on hands and knees. (If you cannot get on the floor then stand by a kitchen counter and place your hands on the countertop. Stand about 12 inches away from the counter). Exhale then round your back toward the ceiling like a cat while tucking your chin to your chest. Release slowly arching your back (sway back) lifting your head. Flow smoothly between the positions for 1 to 2 minutes.

Hip Stretch - Sit in a chair and pull your knee toward your chest. Hold for several seconds and release. Repeat on the opposite side. Do several sets or as many as you need to feel comfortable.

Ankle Circles - Seated or standing; hold on to a counter or sit in a chair, lift one foot and flex and point the foot 3 to 5 times then move the foot in circles. Rotate the foot in one direction 10 times then in the opposite direction 10 times. Switch feet and repeat on the opposite side.

Remember to use slow fluid movements and do daily mobility exercises!

Did you know there is a financial services organization with Lutheran roots?

Thrivent is a membership-owned fraternal organization dedicated to serving the unique needs of their clients – guiding them toward financial choices that will help them live the lives they want today and tomorrow. As a fraternal benefit society, there is a shared purpose with clients who share a common Christian bond, provide mutual protection in the form of insurance and other forms of investment to eligible clients, and offer clients opportunities to support their local communities through Thrivent Member Networks.

Thrivent is the original purpose-based company which was founded more than a century ago when neighbors came together to insure each other. In 1902, 500 founding members contributed \$5 each to mutually support one another; and Aid Association for Lutherans (AAL) was born. 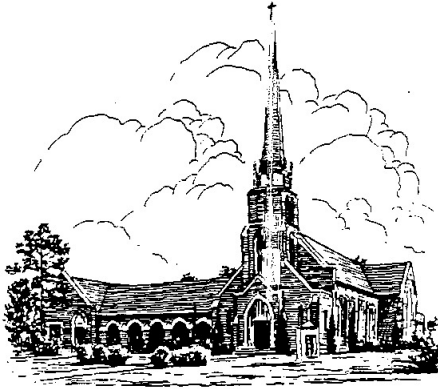
