Pastoral Ponderings

"Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God" Deut 5:12-14

There are two places in Scripture that refer us to, what we know as the Ten Commandments. Once in Exodus 20 as the Israelites were leaving Egypt and heading out into the wilderness towards the Promise Land, and once in a retelling of the Israelites' story in Deuteronomy 5 atop Mt. Sinai. Both lists are congruent, and point to the same Ten Commandments that were to guide Israel's life together, and that set them apart as the people of God. In short, the first three Commandments point to our relationship with God, and the last seven deal with our relationship with each other. In other words, Jesus' summary of the ten commandments down to two greater commandments are: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself." This love of God and love of neighbor, is what defines us as Children of God, along with these ten commandments that protect the relationships we have with God and with our friends.

As we move into the summer months, I lift up the third commandment as one to focus yourself on for several reasons. We are to observe the Sabbath day and keep it holy. We often think about the sabbath as Sunday (for us Christian people at least) a day of worship and a day of rest. We come to church to worship, and connect with our God through the love and life of Jesus Christ. We sing, we pray, we partake in the sacraments, and we dwell within God's Word. Our life is sustained, refilled with God's grace, love, and mercy, and we are sent to be God's faithful people in the world. Summer then, is not a time to take off, sleep in, or miss these important worship opportunities, nor a time to refrain from connecting to God weekly. In other words, God's call for you to worship and pray is continual, and while you need to be here, we need you here just the same.

We worship and keep this sabbath day holy for each other as well. Sunday morning is when God's people meet. We come here to share our lives with each other. We come here to practice love and grace for each other. We come here to find friendship and companions for this journey of life, that point to Jesus for us, and us for them. And we are renewed in love and life because of the sabbath.

The sabbath is a gift of God, for the people of God, and we, as God's people, use this gift whenever we are loving God and loving our neighbors together. Yet, we often forget that God gives the sabbath to us so that we might also love ourselves. While these summer months aren't for missing worship, they are for taking time for yourself, and connecting back and finding the heart within you, that God loves so much. The sabbath is for rest, relaxation, and recuperation – for taking time for yourself to recover from the work and stress of this life, and to rest in the love God and your neighbor has for you. May you find some sabbath these hot summer days in ways that bring you closer to you.

Love God, Love Neighbor, and Love Yourself. These are the three great Commandments and ones that each of you should strive for and protect in your daily endeavors. For God has given Himself to us – love Him! God has given us the community of faithful people to surround us – love them! God has given this world you – love yourself! Amen

Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

Body: Hand and Wrist

Did you know that the adult hand has the most bones? One hand has 27 bones (one foot has one less bone), so both hands have a grand total of 54 bones. It is no wonder that the pain and stiffness of osteoarthritis can be felt in the hands. These 27 bones are distributed within the wrist, palm and fingers. (Carpal bones-wrist 8, Metacarpal bones-palm 5, Phalanges-finger bones 14--3 per finger, 2 for the thumb). So many bones give the ability to grip and squeeze objects. It would be hard to count the number of times we grip and/or squeeze objects during the day. Since our hands do so much work for us, we need to take care of them and give them strengthening exercises just like any other part of the body. Many exercises are simple and can be completed while watching television. Here are some exercises to try!

<u>Grip strengthener</u>: This is a squeezing exercise. Use a stress ball or tennis ball and simply squeeze as hard as you can and hold a few seconds and release. Do 2 to 3 sets of 10 to 15 squeezes.

<u>Finger Extensions</u>: Stretching, this works the opposite of gripping. Use a rubber band around your fingers then spread your fingers apart against the resistance of the rubber band. Do 2 to 3 sets of 10 to 15 stretches.

<u>Thumb Extension</u>: Use a rubber band. Place the rubber band around your hand and wrap the band around your thumb. Press your thumb out, pause, then resist the band as you let the thumb return to resting. Do 2 to 3 sets of 10 to 15 stretches.

<u>Isometric Exercises</u> (holding): lace and lock fingers together then gently try to pull them apart. This is an isometric exercise and strengthens muscles without movement. Do a few of these.

If you can walk around the house, you might want to try the Farmer's Walk.

<u>Farmer's Walk</u>: Hold weights (dumbbells or kettlebells) in each hand and walk around. This engages grip strength and exercises the forearm muscles.

As with any exercise, exercise your hands 2 to 3 times per week and take a day of rest between exercise days. Also, start out with a few reps and work up to the recommended amount.

Mind:

Having a strong grip is important to everyday activities. Being able to do things for yourself can positively impact your state of mind. Studies have shown there is a link to better cognition and developed grey matter with improved grip strength. In turn, this is crucial for information processing in the brain. Who knew that our hands could improve our minds!
