



### **Pastoral Ponderings**

"Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 12:1-2

I write this article on Reformation Day 2025, and have spent the last week thinking about the last 500 years of Reformation history. I have thought about the fight of Martin Luther, and his courage to nail the 95 Theses to the Castle Church doors which sparked a revolution and led to the denomination we know and love today. I have thought about the 139 years of history of Mt. Tabor Lutheran Church in West Columbia, SC, and all the upstanding and courageous Pastors, Music Directors, Council Presidents and members, and the strong lay leadership this Church has produced for the SC Synod and its surrounding community. I have thought about my 13-year tenure at MTLC; the challenges, the successes, and all the ways the congregation has remained faithful through good times and bad. It's important to look backward and see the path God paved for us to walk down, and how faithful Mt. Tabor has walked that path beside Jesus over the years. It's in looking back that we clearly see the places and ways God has shown up for us, which now give us confidence and hope to go forward knowing that Jesus goes with us.

As we look ahead to the future of Mt Tabor, the SC Synod, the ELCA, and the kingdom of God in this world, we do so as new pioneers for the faith. We are called to step out into the unknown with only the promise that Christ goes with us. It's scary out there. It's dangerous where we go. And it could potentially lead us to the valley of the shadow of death, and yet we go anyway.

We go anyway, because God calls us to go into the wilderness of this dark and hurting world trusting that He has already blazed the trail before us. We cannot be too arrogant to think that we are the first to arrive there, but trusting that God goes before us, that Christ walks ahead of the group, we then find that the 'pioneer and perfecter of our faith' has simply left us a trail to follow. So, we pick up our crosses, and follow Him.

This path we are called to faithfully walk is one that will surely lead to the darkest of all valleys, and to a cross that is made for suffering and death. Yet what lies on the other side of that cross is our seat, with Christ, at the right hand of God. You see... "Pioneers get slaughtered, while the settlers prosper." (Daymond John)

It is Christ, the Pioneer of the faith, who has willingly taken on our weak flesh, willingly accepted the shame and suffering of this world, and willing taken our place in death, so that we might find the still waters and green pastures; life eternal and abundant at the feast that has no end. So, we go out with confidence and hope that God goes with us ... into a world that is chaotic and broken. We have faith that Jesus and the saints too have gone before us, and we do the work of the one who blazed the trail and calls us to follow.

We will gather on November 2<sup>nd</sup> and celebrate those saints and pioneers that led us to where we are now. Our beloved family, who helped shape and mold us, and who, more importantly, introduced us to Jesus, and taught us to follow Him faithfully. We will light a candle and we will remember them. We will sing songs and bless the Lord and remember His promises to keep us, with them, in His heart forever. We will remember their bravery and their creative leadership, and we will give thanks. And then we will go... wherever God calls us, wherever Jesus leads us, and wherever the Holy Spirit pushes us; so that one day, we too can rest in our seat at the right hand of God. Amen!

Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

Body: Upper Legs

Your upper leg is also known as the thigh. The muscles in the thigh allow the leg to bend, work with your hips and allows the knee to extend. Thigh muscles allow the legs to move inward and outward, and to flex and rotate at the hip. These muscles are some of the largest muscles in the body. They are located on the front, back and inside of the thighs. These muscles keep your hips and leg in alignment and assist with balance. Strong thigh muscles help to support the knee and prevent knee pain. Keeping thigh muscles strong are important because they support most of the body's weight. There are many exercises that can keep them strong and supportive.




Squats are some of the best-known exercises for the upper legs (quads). There are different kinds of squats you can do. If you have never done squats the best way to start is with a chair directly behind you. Stand in front of the chair as if you are going to sit in the chair. Slowly lower down but do not actually sit. When you almost touch the chair stand back up. Repeat until you can do 10 squats. As you get stronger, do squats a few times each day. Once you have developed the quad

muscles, you can try the squats without the chair behind you.

Lunges help to develop the quad muscles. You can do forward lunges, reverse lunges and lateral (side) lunges and finally walking lunges. You don't have to go as low as the image below shows but make sure that your knee does not go over your foot.

These are the most common exercises for the upper leg. However, everyday activities such as walking up stairs work these muscles. Playing outside with the kids, running and





Strong quads are important for mobility, getting up and down and supporting the knees and hips. Being mobile is important for general wellbeing. When you can get around and do the things you like to do, you are happier and healthier.
