Pastoral Ponderings

"Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it." ~1 Cor. 9:24

People have asked me over the last few weeks about what I have given up for Lent, and I've told them, "Nothing. I gave up nothing." I didn't give up eating chocolate or sweet tea, I didn't go on some extreme diet, and I didn't give up some vice that I had been struggling with. I didn't give up anything that I hadn't already decided to give up before Lent. I simply didn't participate in the "giving up" practices of Lent this year.

What I did do for Lent this year, was to add things into my life that I thought would challenge who I was and change me for the better. Most of these things have not been easily accomplished, but activities that would be hard in nature, so that my fairly comfortable life would experience adversity, and in turn, grow stronger because of the resistance I was feeling. So, I started waking up most days at 4am and I started training to run a marathon. Along with a few other obstacles that were mostly just designed to make my life a little harder in general, nothing prepares you for that alarm to go off at 4:00 in the morning. After doing it for some time, it doesn't get easier to pop out of bed; not to mention how cold it has been and how warm those covers are. So, every morning I fight the urge to roll over and go back to sleep.

Then, there are the training runs. Every morning I strap on my shoes and head out to accomplish some sort of physical activity that will push me for miles down the road. Several mornings a week, I push through a 5k (3.1 miles) or a 10k (6.2 miles) and condition my body for my longer runs that happen on Friday. These runs right now are around the 10 - 13 - 16 mile territory, and I am adding miles every week to stretch out toward my goal of my first marathon (26.2 miles), booked for May 1.

The shorter runs are fine and fairly easy now, since I have become used to running those on a daily basis, but these longer runs, especially for someone who doesn't consider themselves a runner, has challenged me in ways I did not expect, and in ways I was not ready for. Physically, I can tell these miles are wearing on me, but what I wasn't ready for was the emotional, mental, and even spiritual challenges that these runs posed. While my body is tired at the end of these long jogs, my soul has been put through the ringer as well. With each step, God and I wrestle with each other, and with each passing mile, I can tell the Holy Spirit is turning me inside outward.

What I have come to find is that the adversity and resistance that I have added to my life is not only helping my body become more physically fit, but my faith is growing deeper and stronger because of it. When I start to hit mile 13, 14, & 15, and I am completely exhausted, I find myself starting to rely on God to get through, to sustain me and my energy, and to guide my steps to the finish line. The amazing thing is that this prayer time has extended itself to the rest of my life, and I have found my faith stronger in all aspects of my life.

As Easter approaches, I encourage you to use this season, these next 50 days of Easter, to do something difficult in your life that will lead to the same faithful growth in mind, body, and spirit. It may not be a marathon you are training for, but adversity and resistance, something controlled, but difficult in your life could lead you to a deeper faith than you could have ever imagined. For in that difficulty, you will find yourself relying on God in ways you didn't think you could, and I think you will surprise yourself on what you can accomplish when you give your all. As 1 Cor. 9 goes on to say, "Athletes exercise self-control in all things; they do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable one. So I do not run aimlessly, nor do I box as though beating the air; but I punish my body and enslave it, so that after proclaiming to others I myself should not be disqualified." Amen




We have resumed our Noon Eucharist services on Wednesdays. We will continue to follow Covid-19 safety protocols.


