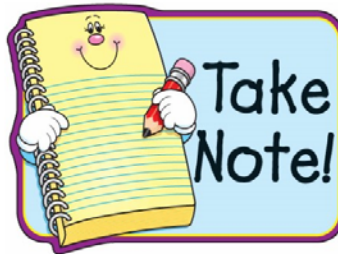

Council Meeting

The next scheduled Council meeting will be Sunday, August 11th, at 7:00 pm in the Easley Conference Room.

Council Highlights

Votes Taken:

- Minutes were approved unanimously.
- A motion was made to transfer the Music & Arts Fund from Security Federal to First Citizens pending discussion with the chairperson of the Music & Arts Committee. The motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made to apply to the Lexington Historical Society for a grant to replace 3 sets of wooden outside doors at the front of the church. If the grant is not approved, it will come back to council to address. The motion passed unanimously.

Pastoral Ponderings

“For everyone will be salted with fire. Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you season it? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another.” ~Mark 9:49-50

When I was a kid, I cut my leg at a campground we were staying at while on vacation at the beach. My mom put ointment on it and a Band-Aid and off I went to play again. By that night, because of all the dirt and mud I had been playing around, that cut started getting red and still hurt all the way until the next morning. As we all woke up, my dad and I walked down to the beach and he told me to walk out into the surf and make sure that cut got down into the salt water. I did, and it burned and started stinging like crazy and out of the water I came as quickly as I could. He made me go back in and make sure that cut got washed out thoroughly in that salt water. I cried! It hurt! And all the more he made me stay there until it was all cleaned out. He just kept saying over and over, “This salt water is the best thing for it, we have to clean it out so it can heal.”

Over the last month, we as a faith community have hurt deeply, and needless to say, we long for the pain to stop. We all are praying for healing, hoping that our wounds will stop stinging and burning, and longing for things to return to normal once again. We know God is here, we know God brings healing and wholeness in due time, yet we want it now, and we don't want to wait for the time true healing needs to take to make things whole again. The temptation is to rush towards healing by simply putting Band-Aids on things and hoping everything will be fine, but, we know all too well that while Band-Aids can help get us through, they don't actually help heal anything.

God invites us all to let the salt water get into our wounds and clean all the infection out and heal us all from the inside out. God invites us to have the hard conversations, to do the hard work of binding ourselves to one another, and to engage in the hard work of peace making through forgiveness and authentic reconciliation.

Nothing about the work God is inviting us into is going to be easy. In fact, it will bring pain of its own. But if we do the hard work of healing now, not only will we be able to heal, but we will be stronger for it.

God is a God of healing and wholeness, and God wants to bring that healing to us now. However, we have a major part in allowing that healing to take place in us, and what we do now, together, will dictate how we move forward in the life God has planned for us.

So people of Mt. Tabor, let the salt water in, let it get deep into our wounds and start to clean out the infection that threatens to hurt us even more. Let that water permeate our skin and bones, and let God's healing presence give us life and life abundant. For it truly is the best thing for us. Amen!

Sunshine Club Meeting

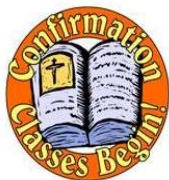
